**BULLETIN:** Papal Palm Sunday Procession Gets Lost 01-Apr-2007

For seven hundred years, the annual papal Palm Sunday procession has followed approximately the same route, but this year the pope took a wrong turn, leading thousands down alleys, through a coffee bar and into a rail yard, where the procession degenerated into a chaos of waving palm fronds and sheep, which escaped from a stopped cattle train in the confusion. A distraught Pope Benedict XVI announced that this was just another indication that the end times are upon us. "Strange behavior and odd signs indicate the approach of the latter days," he said as he used his symbolic staff in the actual herding of sheep.

### CLASSROOM DESKS?

Back in September of 2005, on the first day of school, Martha Cothren, a social studies school teacher at Robinson High School in Little Rock, did something not to be forgotten. On the first day of school, with permission of the school superintendent, the principal and the building supervisor, she took all of the desks out of the classroom.

The kids came into first period, they walked in, there were no desks. They obviously looked around and said, "Ms. Cothren, where's our desk?" And she said, "You can't have a desk until you tell me how you earn them."

They thought, "Well, maybe it's our grades."

"No," she said.

"Maybe it's our behavior."

And she told them, "No, it's not even your behavior."

And so they came and went in the first period, still no desks in the classroom. Second period, same thing. Third period. By early afternoon television news crews had gathered in Ms. Cothren's class to find out about this crazy teacher who had taken all the desks out of the classroom. The last period of the day, Martha Cothren gathered her class. They were at this time sitting on the floor around the sides of the room. And she says, "Throughout the day no one has really understood how you earn the desks that sit in this classroom

ordinarily." She said, "Now I'm going to tell you."

Martha Cothren went over to the door of her classroom and opened it, and as she did 27 U.S. veterans, wearing their uniforms, walked into that classroom, each one carrying a school desk. And they placed those school desks in rows, and then they stood along the wall. And by the time they had finished placing those desks, those kids for the first time I think perhaps in their lives understood how they earned those desks.

Martha said, "You don't have to earn those desks. These guys did it for you. They put them out there for you, but it's up to you to sit here responsibly to learn, to be good students and good citizens, because they paid a price for you to have that desk, and don't ever forget it."

Huffington Institute hopes to bridge differences between Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy

LOS ANGELES — An institute established at Loyola Marymount University will try to heal centuries-old wounds between the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches.

The Huffington Ecumenical Institute, officially launched in February, was boosted by a \$5 million pledge from philanthropist Michael Huffington.

The endowment will be matched by the university over several years.

Huffington, 59, who is a member of an Orthodox Church, said he wanted to "bring orthodoxy and Catholicism closer together" so they ultimately would be able to share Communion together in a church.

"What they believe in is so very similar, in many respects, that the differences ought to be bridged, and that's what we're going to try to do," Huffington said, calling himself an optimist.

The official split between the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches traditionally dates to 1054 because of political and ecclesiastical differences.

Differences span a range of theological issues.

For example, the Catholic Church sees the pope as its supreme authority on earth. The autonomous churches that constitute Eastern Orthodoxy, such as the Greek, Serbian and Romanian Orthodox churches, consider themselves both one church and a family of churches.

None is under the jurisdiction of another. Also, within the Orthodox tradition, priests can marry.
