## THE PASCHAL SERMON OF ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM EARLY CHURCH FATHER 347AD – 407AD

If any man be devout and love God, let him enjoy this fair and radiant triumphal feast.

If any man be a wise servant, let him enter rejoicing into the joy of his Lord.

If any have labored long in fasting, let him now receive his recompense. If any have wrought from the first hour, let him today receive his just reward.

If any have come at the third hour, let him with thankfulness keep the feast.

If any have arrived the sixth hour, let him have no misgivings, because he shall in no wise be deprived.

If any have delayed until the ninth hour, let him draw near, fearing nothing. If any have tarried even until the eleventh hour, let him also be not alarmed at his tardiness; for the Lord, who is jealous of his honor, will accept the last even as the first; he gives rest unto him who comes at the eleventh hour, even as unto him who has worked from the first hour. And he shows mercy upon the last, and cares for the first; and to the one he gives, and upon the other he bestows gifts.

And he both accepts the deeds, and welcomes the intention, and honors the acts and praises the offering.

Wherefore, enter ye all into the joy of your Lord, and receive your reward, both the first and likewise the second.

You rich and poor together, hold high festival. You sober and you heedless, honor the day.

Rejoice today, both you who have fasted and you who have disregarded the fast. The table is fully laden; feast sumptuously. The calf is fatted; let no one go hungry away. Enjoy the feast of faith; receive all the riches of loving-kindness.

Let no one bewail his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep for his iniquities, for pardon has shone forth from the grave.

Let no one fear death, for the Savior's death has set us free: he that was held prisoner of it has annihilated it.

By descending into hell, he made hell captive. He embittered it when it tasted of his flesh. And Isaiah, foretelling this, cried: "Hell was embittered when it encountered thee in the lower regions."

It was embittered, for it was abolished. It was embittered, for it was mocked.

It was embittered, for it was slain. It was embittered, for it was overthrown.

It was embittered, for it was fettered in chains.

It took a body, and met God face to face. It took earth, and encountered heaven.

It took that which was seen, and fell upon the unseen.

O Death, where is your sting? O Hell, where is your victory?

Christ is risen, and you are overthrown.

Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen.

Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice.

Christ is risen, and life reigns.

Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave.

For Christ, being risen from the dead, is become the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

To him be glory and dominion unto ages of ages.

Amen!

The **Paschal greeting** is an <u>Easter</u> custom among <u>Eastern Orthodox</u>, <u>Oriental Orthodox</u> and <u>Eastern Catholic</u> Christians, as well as among several Roman Catholic and Protestant Christians. Instead of "hello" or its equivalent, one is to greet another person with "Christ is Risen!", and the response is "Truly He is Risen!" or "He Has Risen Indeed!" (compare <u>Matthew</u> <u>27:64</u>, <u>Matthew</u> <u>28:6-7</u>, <u>Mark</u> <u>16:6</u>, <u>Luke</u> <u>24:6</u>, <u>Luke</u> <u>24:34</u>).

In some cultures, e.g., in Russia, it was also customary to exchange a triple kiss after the greeting: one cheek, another cheek, lips.

It is not uncommon for Orthodox Christians to compile lists of the greeting as it is used around the world, as an act of Orthodox unity across languages and cultures.

Similar responses are also used in the <u>liturgies</u> of <u>other Christian churches</u>, but not so much as general greetings.

Ortho Thought for the Day (the most frequently committed sin)

Sins of the tongue are the most frequent and the readiest sins. "If any man offend not in word, he is a perfect man," says the Apostle James. When a repentant man sets out on God's path, when he begins to live according to God's commandments, let him strive first not to sin with his tongue. This was the rule that the repentant David laid down for himself. He decided especially to keep silent before his adversaries: "I will keep my mouth...with a bridle while the ungodly are in my sight." This is a wonderful rule for a man being healed of sin. When he is accused, he makes no reply; when he is slandered he keeps silent.

Also, we do not say the prayer to the Holy Spirit, "O Heavenly King," until Pentecost Sunday.

For nearly two thousand years, this cry has resounded throughout the Christian world at the Resurrection Divine Liturgy. It brings us the true reason that we celebrate the Liturgy every Sunday—that Christ arose from the dead to open the gates to Heaven for all those who dwelled in the darkness of nothing. Our cares are set aside as we truly celebrate from our hearts—not mere words, but the entire concept that a dead man, buried for three days, arose to spread God's love for His children to all the world.

As we celebrate this Feast of Feasts, let us also remember those in our community who are less fortunate and in need—the poor, the sick, those in prison, and those alone and in despair. Bringing the Good News is part of who we are—call someone, on the phone or in person, who you think can

benefit from your voice—tell them that Christ IS Risen—this is always in the present tense, as it is a living and constant event in the cosmos.

May our Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ grant you all His Peace, Love, and Grace all the days of your life—but most specially this Pascha.

Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen! Christos Voskres! Voistinu Voskres! Christos Anesti! Alithos Anesti! Kristo Amefufukka! Kweli Amefufukka!
