ALLELUIA VERSES—TONE 2

Save the king, O Lord, and hear us on the day we call!

When Symeon (archbishop of Seleucia and Ctesiphon) was being conducted to prison, Usthazanes, an aged eunuch, the foster-father of Shapur (II, king of Sassanian Persia, 309-379) and superintendent of the palace, who happened to be sitting at the gates of the palace, arose to do him reverence. Symeon reproachfully forbade him in a loud and haughty voice, averted his countenance, and passed by; for the eunuch had been formerly a Christian, but had recently yielded to authority, and had worshiped the sun (became a Zoroastrian). This conduct so affected the eunuch that he wept aloud, laid aside the white garment with which he was robed, and clothed himself, as a mourner, in black. He then seated himself in front of the palace, crying and groaning, and saying, "Woe is me! What must not await me since I have denied God; and on this account Symeon, formerly my familiar friend, does not think me worthy of being spoken to, but turns away and hastens from me."

When Shapur heard of what had occurred, he called the eunuch to him, and inquired into the cause of his grief, and asked him whether any calamity had befallen his family. Usthazanes replied and said, "O king, nothing has occurred to my family; but I would rather have suffered any other affliction whatsoever than that which has befallen me, and it would have been easy to bear. Now I mourn because I am alive, and ought to have been dead long ago; yet I still see the sun which, not voluntarily, but to please thee, I professed to

worship. Therefore, on both accounts, it is just that I should die, for I have been a betrayer of Christ, and a deceiver of thee." He then swore by the Maker of heaven and earth that he would never swerve from his convictions. Shapur astonished at the wonderful conversion of the eunuch, was still more enraged against the Christians, as if they had affected it by enchantments. Still, he spared the old man, and strove with all his strength, by alternate gentleness and harshness, to bring him over to his own sentiments. But finding that his efforts were useless, and that Usthazanes persisted in declaring that he would never be so foolish as to worship the creature instead of the creator, he became inflamed with passion, and commanded that the eunuch's head should be struck off with a sword.

When the executioners came forward to perform their office, Usthazanes requested them to wait a little, that he might communicate something to the king. He then called one of the most faithful eunuchs, and bade him say to Shapur, "From my youth until now I have been well affected, O king, to your house, and have ministered with fitting diligence to your father and yourself. I need no witnesses to corroborate my statements; these facts are well established. For all the matters wherein at divers times I have gladly served you, grant me this reward; let it not be imagined by those who are ignorant of the circumstances, that I have incurred this punishment by acts of unfaithfulness against the kingdom, or by the commission of any other crime; but let it be published and proclaimed abroad by a herald, that Usthazanes loses his head for no knavery that he has ever committed in the palaces, but for being a Christian, and for refusing to obey the king in denying his own God." The eunuch delivered this message, and Shapur, according to the request of Usthazanes, commanded a herald to make the desired proclamation; for the king imagined that others would be easily deterred from embracing Christianity, by reflecting that he who sacrificed his aged fosterfather and esteemed household servant, would assuredly spare no other Christian. Usthazanes, however, believed that as by his timidity in consenting to worship the sun, he had caused many Christians to fear, so now, by the diligent proclamation of the cause of his sufferings, many might be edified by learning that he died for the sake of religion, and so became imitators of his fortitude. Try to attain to the full measure of this Name (of Jesus), and you will find it in your mouth and on the mouths of your children. When you make high festival and when you rejoice, cry Jesus. When anxious and in pain, cry Jesus. When little boys and girls are laughing, let them cry Jesus. And to those who flee before barbarians, cry Jesus. And those who go down to the Nile, cry Jesus. And those who see wild beasts and sights of terror, cry Jesus. Those who are taken off to prison, cry Jesus. And those whose trial has been corrupted and who receive injustice, cry the Name of Jesus.

Certain monks, called "the Prayer People" because they wanted to dedicate themselves entirely to prayer, went to pay a visit to abba Lucius. The aged monk asked them, "What work do you do?" They said, "We don't do work, but we obey Paul's teaching to pray without ceasing." The old man asked them, "Do you eat?" and they replied, "Yes." The abba then demanded to know who prayed instead of them while they were eating. Then he asked them, "Do you sleep?' and they replied, "Yes." The abba then demanded a second time to know who prayed instead of them while they were sleeping. The monks were at a loss to answer either of the two questions.

Then the old man continued, "Forgive me, but you are not doing what you say you are. I, on the other hand, succeed in working with my hands and at the same time in praying without ceasing. I start by sitting down in the presence of God. Then I being my task of making ropes and I say, "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions."

Then he asked them if that was prayer and they replied, "Yes." The old man went on, "At the end of the day passed in work and prayer, I have earned roughly sixteen coins. Two coins I deposit on the ground outside the door and the rest I spend on food. The person who picks up the two coins prays in my place when I am eating or sleeping. In this way, by the grace of God, I am obedient to the teaching to pray without ceasing."

The Lord never ceases calling us to Himself: "Come unto me, and I will give you rest." He nourishes us with His most precious Body and Blood. In His mercy He schools us by His Word and the Holy Spirit. He has revealed His mysteries to us. He lives in us and in the sacraments of the Church, and leads us to where we shall behold His glory. But this glory shall each man behold according to the measure of his love. The more a man loves, the ardently does he set his face towards God, yearning to be with the Beloved Lord, and therefore will he approach the nearer to Him; while the man who loves but little will have but little desire for the Lord, and man who does not love at all will neither wish nor aspire to see the Lord, and will spend his life in darkness.
