One day the all-wise (St. John the Almsgiver) heard of a generous giver and so he sent for him privately and said jokingly, "How is it that you became so generous? Was it natural to you, or did you put constraint upon yourself?" Some to whom he put this same question stood shamefacedly before him and would not answer, whilst others would tell him their story.

One man whom the Saint questioned answered as follows: "As a fact, master, I neither give anything nor do any good; but the little I do give and do from that which comes to me through Christ and your prayers I came to do in this way. Formerly I was very hardhearted and unsympathetic and one day I lost money and was reduced to poverty. Then my reason began to say to me: "Truly, if you had been charitable, God would not have forsaken you." And thereupon I decided to give five copper coins a day to the poor. But when I started giving them Satan immediately checked me by saying: 'Those copper coins would really have been enough to buy a bathticket or vegetables for your family." Then I felt at once as if I were taking the money out of my children's mouth and so I gave nothing.

'But I noticed I was being mastered by this vice, so said to my slave: "I want you to steal five copper coins daily without my noticing it, and give them in charity." For I am a moneychanger, master.

'My slave, worthy fellow, began by stealing ten coppers, and occasionally even a silver coin. As he noticed that we were being blessed, he began to steal gold coins too, and give them away.

'One day I was expressing my astonishment at God's blessings to us, I said to him: "Those five copper coins, boy, have greatly benefited us. So now I want you to give ten." At that the slave said to me with a smile:

"Yes, be thankful for my thefts, since but for them we should not even have bread to eat today. However if there can be a just thief, I am he!" And then he told me that he had given silver and even gold coins.

So it was through his faith, master, that I grew accustomed to giving with all my heart.'

The holy Patriarch was much edified by this story and said: 'Truly I have read many stories in the lives of the fathers, but I have never heard anything like this!"

Leontius, Life of St. John the Almsgiver 38

In death the soul that has come to know God through the Holy Spirit experiences a measure of dread when the angels bring her before the Lord, since while living in the world she was guilty of sin. But when the soul beholds the Lord, she rejoices in His meek and merciful countenance, and the Lord in the abundance of His gentleness and love remembereth not her sins. One glance at the Lord, and love of Him will take up its abode in the soul, and from love of God and the sweetness of the Holy Spirit she will be completely transformed. *St. Silouan the Athonite*

The next day, once again the populace (of Neocaesarea in Pontus) was on his (St. Gregory the Wonderworker's) doorstep, along with their wives and children and the aged and those on whom the spirits or some other misfortune had laid some bodily affliction. In their midst, that man measured out what was suitable to the needs of each person in the assemblage, through the power of the Spirit: preaching, jointly examining, admonishing, teaching and healing. For he won over the greatest number to his preaching because what they saw coincided with what they heard, and the tokens of divine power shone upon him through the divine power through both. His words confirmed what they heard; the miracles of healing astonishingly confirmed what they saw. The griever was comforted, youth made wise, the aged ministered to by appropriate words. Slaves were taught to be loyal to their masters; the powerful, to be kind to the lowly; the poor, that virtue alone is wealth and the winning of it is within everyone's reach; and the man fortunate in his riches was properly admonished that he should consider himself not the master but the steward of his possessions. To women he dispensed what was profitable to them; to children, what suited their age; to parents, what was proper. At that time, then, all were astonished, both those in the city and roundabout, by the apostolic miracles. Everything he said and did they believed to be the work of divine power; nor did they rate any court more authoritative in disputes

about earthly matters, but every judgment and every tangled situation was made straight through his counsel.

Gregory of Nyssa, "Life of St. Gregory Thaumaturgus (the Wonderworker)" 922-924, St. Gregory Thaumaturgus (ca. 213 – ca. 270 AD), commemorated 17/30 November

It also happened that a woman of the same locality (Salzburg, Austria) who had suffered from a long sickness, lay half dead, and the funeral was already prepared. Her relatives, in mournful silence, buried funeral laments under the voice of faith, and placed the body that was almost exhausted by the illness at the doorstep of the saintly man's monastery (St. Severinus, mid 5th century). The man of God, seeing the entrance blocked by the bed, said to them, "What is it that you have decided to do?" They answered, "That by your prayers the dead should be given back to life."

Then he said with tears, "Why do demand a great thing of a lowly man? I know I am utterly unworthy. If I could only find pardon for my sins!" And they, "We believe that she will revive if you pray." Then St. Severinus at once threw himself down on the ground in prayer, with tears, and the woman immediately arose. He addressed her thus: "Do not attribute any of these things to my own doing. It is the fervor of your faith that has deserved this grace, and this has happened in many places and among many races in order that it may be made known that there is one God, who works miracles in heaven and on earth, who raises the damned to salvation and restores the dead to life." The woman who had recovered her health, after three days, resumed work in the fields with her own hands, as was the custom of the province.
