"Why do they put rubber tires with inner tubes on cars? So that they give in, collapsing a little with every little stone or pothole in the road, and in this way they pass obstacles. If the wheels were firm and unyielding, the car wouldn't be able to move forward. It would fall apart after a short distance because of the vibration from the small inconsistencies of terrain. The same thing happens with yielding to others in the family. In this way many problems are surpassed and continuous spiritual progress is assured." *Elder Epiphanios of Athens*, +1989

The fathers used to tell how Abba Serapion (the Sindonite) sold himself to some Greek actors in one of the towns for twenty coins. He wrapped up the coins and kept them on himself. He stayed with the actors who had bought him for a long time, until he had made them Christians, and then withdrew from the theater, taking nothing but bread and water. Nor did his mouth ever cease from discussing the Scriptures.

After some time the actor was seized with compassion, then the actress, then their whole family. It was said that for as long as they did not recognize him, he would even wash the feet of both of them. In any case, both were baptized and gave up performing on the stage. They led a holy and pious life, and they had the highest respect for him and told him, "Come, brother, let us set you free, since you freed us from our shameful slavery." He said to them, "Since God worked grace in your souls and saved you, I may tell you the secrets of my business. I had compassion on your souls. I am a free man, and an Egyptian ascetic, and I sold myself for your sakes so that you might be saved. Now since God brought this about and your souls have been saved through my debasement, take your money so

that I may go and help others." They entreated him and gave their assurance that "we will have you as our own father and master only stay with us!" Still they could not persuade him. Then they told him, "Give the money to the poor, for it is our first pledge of salvation. But at least visit us once a year."

He (later) went on to Lacedaemonia (Sparta) and heard about one of the first men of the city who together with his whole family was Manichaean, but righteous in everything else. He sold himself to this man as in the earlier case, and within two years he had turned the man and his wife away from heresy to the Church. Then they no longer regarded him as a servant, but as a relative, a brother, or a father, and they gave glory to God. *Palladius, Lausiac History, 37.2 4, 8*

Abba Serapion the Sindonite, commemorated 14/27 May

Some thoughts from Father Juvenaly [Repass]:

One of my favorite quotes from the saints of our Church is (if I remember correctly) from the Ladder of Divine Ascent. It says, "Expecting to find humility in a heretic, is like expecting snow to burst into flame." It's very, very true. I think it does not speak of those heretics who are genuinely seeking truth, but of those who are confirmed in their erroneous belief and are not seeking the truth. I am not citing it in order to judge, criticize, or condemn, but to highlight a spiritual truth about the relationship between humility and theological truth.

Humility is not listed among the fruit of the Spirit (Gal 5:22-23) but much is said about it in the Ladder and in the Philokalia. Several things about it are said in the New Testament:

(a) Jesus highly values it, saying "whoever exalts himself [lifts himself up] will be humbled [brought low], and he who humbles himself will be exalted";

(b) humility is the opposite of pride, which was the beginning of all evilfor it was what caused the devil to fall from heaven. when he sought to exalt himself (a perfect example of what Christ said, just quoted);

(c) the content of humility includes self-denial and and choosing the will of God over one's own will - for Christ said, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself ... and follow Me. ..."

(d) Jesus Christ followed the most excellent way of humility when he washed the feet of the disciples, and when he accepted the Cross, rejecting his own will and obeying the Father's will - perfectly expressed in his prayer, "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will."

(e) St. Paul refers to Christ's humility, saying "He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross." This humility of Christ - of God - is awesome when one considers that being God himself, he accepted to be crucified.

(f) As St. John of the Ladder notes in the step on humility, this virtue is divine and resists definition.

(g) God is the best teacher of humility, but even God cannot humble someone who refuses to be humbled. For Christ's words quoted above in (c)
"let him deny himself" - can also be translated "he must deny himself."
God can arrange things to help the process, but a person must humble himself.

REMINDERS: <u>NO KNEELING</u> until the Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost Sunday. Instead of "Vechnaya Pam'yat" at the end of a Parastas or during a funeral service *until Ascension Thursday*, we sing "Christ is Risen!" Also, we do not say the prayer to the Holy Spirit "O Heavenly King" until Pentecost Sunday.
