Abba Theodore of Pherme asked Abba Pambo, "Give me a word." With much difficulty he said to him, "Theodore, go and have pity on all, for through pity, one finds freedom of speech (Greek=access) before God."

This tidbit is from the Sunday Bulletin from the parish of St. Stephen the First Martyr Orthodox Mission, Lima, OH. Enjoy!

Orthodox" means "right teaching," or, "true worship." Ours is the Church founded by Jesus Christ, which wrote and compiled the Bible. We follow the rich Tradition of the Apostles and the early Church, down through the centuries. There are over 255 million Orthodox Christians worldwide. Believing Holy Communion to be the most sacred and intimate mystery, only those who affirm all of the following may receive the Holy Eucharist:

- I believe Jesus Christ is God and I confess Him as my Master.
- I have been Baptized in the Name of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit, and Chrismated in the Orthodox Church.
- I profess the Nicene Creed and the entire Orthodox Christian Faith, the Ecumenical Councils and Holy Tradition of the Church.
- I am at peace with all, holding absolutely no grudge or malice toward anyone (Church members, spouse, parents, children, employer, employee, neighbor, priest, friend, enemy, anyone)

Spiritual Counsels of the Blessed Elder Paisios of Mt. Athos +1994

That fulfilling a vow we make to God does NOT replace our need for repentance and confession

"I also see a new craftiness in the devil. He causes people to think that if they make a vow to God and fulfill it, if they go on some pilgrimage, then they are alright spiritually. You see hordes of people going to monasteries and shrines with tall candles and extravagant offerings, ostentatiously making the sign of the cross, even weeping a little, and feeling content. They do not repent, do not confess, do not correct or change their way of life ... and this is quite pleasing to the devil."

One of the high government officials bore a grudge against another. Great John (the Almsgiver, patriarch of Alexandria, 610-619), heard of this and admonished him several times, but could not persuade him to be reconciled with his enemy. One day therefore the saint sent and had him fetched on the pretext of some public business, and as soon as he had come the patriarch held a service in his oratory, no one else being present save his syncellus.

After the patriarch had said the prayer of consecration and had pronounced the opening words of the Lord's Prayer, the three of them began to repeat the Prayer. When they got to the sentence, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" the patriarch made a sign to the syncellus to stop, and he himself stopped too, and the magistrate commenced saying all by himself, "Forgive us as we forgive." At once the saint turned towards him and said in a gentle voice, "Consider in what an awful moment you are saying to God, 'As I forgive, do Thou forgive me'!" Immediately, as though tormented by fire, the magistrate fell on his face at the saint's feet crying, "Whatever you command, my lord, your servant will do." And from that time he was reconciled to his enemy in all sincerity. Leontius, Life of John the Almsgiver, 39

A prayer of St. Silouan the Athonite:

O holy Virgin Mary, tell us, thy children, of thy love on earth for thy Son and God.

Tell us how thy spirit rejoiced in God thy Savior, Tell us of how thou didst look upon His fair countenance, and reflect that this was He Whom all the heavenly hosts wait upon in awe and love.

Tell us what thy soul felt when thou didst bear the wondrous Babe in thine arms.

We long to know of thy life on earth with the Lord but thou wast not minded to commit all these things to writing, and didst veil thy secret heart in silence.

Spiritual Counsels of the Blessed Elder Paisios of Mt. Athos +1994 IF YOU ALREADY HAVE A SPIRITUAL FATHER, SKIP THE INFORMATION BELOW, AND PROCEED TO TONIGHT'S TEACHING

Several of you have requested what one can do to find a spiritual father. The main thing is to pray fervently to our Lord to lead you to the person He has chosen to be your guide to His Kingdom. Included with tonight's teaching is a prayer by St. Symeon the New Theologian. I suggest that you offer his Spirit-filled words a few times each day; and the Theotokos Fast, which begins on Monday, also provides one with additional tools in finding a soul physician.

"O Lord, Who desirest not the death of the sinner but that he should turn and live, Thou Who didst come down to earth in order to restore life to those lying dead through sin and in order to make them worthy of seeing Thee—the true Light—as far as it is possible to man, send me a man who knows Thee; so that—in serving him and subjecting myself to him, as to Thee, and in doing Thy will in his—I may please Thee—the only true God. And so that even I, a sinner, may be worthy of Thy Kingdom. Amen."

That finding a Spiritual Father is of paramount importance "The most necessary thing today is for people to find a Spiritual Father, to confess, trust him and follow his advice. If people have a spiritual guide and establish a rule of prayer and study, if they go to Church on a regular basis and receive Holy Communion, then they have nothing to fear in this life."

That seeking the guidance of a Spiritual Father opens one's heart to God's grace, to humility, and to clarity "No matter how spiritual a person is, and how well he may take care of his personal affairs on his own, he still won't be entirely at peace with that; because God wants man to be helped

by another person—to be corrected by another person. The Good God works things out in this manner so a person may become humble."
