The Nativity of Christ: Points to Consider

- The Nativity Fast begins on November 15/28 and continues until the Feast of the Nativity on December 25/January 7.
- Believers are expected to abstain from meat and dairy products during the Nativity Fast.
- The mind, the heart, the soul and the body are to prepare for the celebration of the birth of the Lord Jesus Christ
- Christ's birth is celebrated as a "present event."
- The greeting on the Feast of the Nativity is: Christ is Born!"
- The services declare: "God is with us!"
- Believers are expected to maintain perspective.
- The birth of Christ is the guiding event giving reason to the Fast.
- The reason to celebrate comes on the Feast itself.
- Attending the Divine Liturgy on the Feast of the Nativity and receiving the Precious Body and Blood of Christ is most fitting.
- The celebration of the Feast of the Nativity continues until December 31/January 13.

- Maintaining a demeanor of love, kindness and peace.
- Being joyful due to the birth of Christ.
- Being grateful for the birth of Christ.
- Sharing the message of Christ's love.
- Being rooted in the Gospel of Christ.
- Being appreciative of forefathers and mothers having kept the Faith through the centuries.
- Being firmly united with Christ.
- Firmly rejecting the ways that dilute the celebration of the Feast of the Nativity.
- Being vigilant and careful to protect and care for the soul.
- Exhibit conduct pleasing to Christ.
- Abstain from thought and actions abhorrent to Christ and others.
- Share the love of Christ in daily relationships.
- Think carefully about the birth of Christ.
- Think about the humility of Christ.
- Consider the physical growth Christ experienced.
- Remember the Virgin Birth of Christ.
- Be appreciative of the Holy Spirit.
