a word from the desert: Young people must be made to distinguish between helpful and injurious knowledge, keeping clearly in mind the Christian's purpose in life. So, like the athlete or the musician, they must bend every energy to one task, the winning of the heavenly crown. St. Basil the Great, 4th century

When the judge had seen how strongly the martyr (St. Menas) was resisting everything which was being said and done to him, he readied not for further interrogation but for the final sentence. Having consulted with those who were of one mind with him in his impiety, he passed the death penalty upon Menas. He set by his side a guard with a drawn sword, and indicated the place outside of the city. When the place had been reached, and the second lap [of his contest] was revealed to the martyr as more glorious than the first, he met some people whom he knew a little and with a prayer he blessed them with the sign of the cross. He appeared full of joy, as one who bears in mind the happiness which has been laid aside for him, so that he advanced in thanksgiving to the happiness which he had not yet received. He said, "I thank you, Lord Jesus, that you have counted me worthy to be seen to share in your suffering, and have not given me as food to the wild beasts, but have brought it about that I will preserve my faith in you pure until the end." When he had said these things and kneeled down, he bent forward to receive the blow of the sword. And after the blow the holy body was burned on a fire. Thus the martyr's perishable corpse was destroyed, but his soul was carried away by angels to his blessed lot. Then some pious men became concerned for the remains of the martyr, so that they gathered them up from the fire and stored them in well-known locations. When they had gathered them up and wrapped them in fine cloth, had anointed them with oils and perfumes, and had done everything for them which it was right for them to do, a little later they returned each to his own native land, just as the martyr had instructed them before his death. For it was right that that land which had both given birth to and nourished him should receive him perfected by his martyrdom, that none should take the place of the mother, and no land except this enjoy the grace of the martyr's relics. This was wisely accomplished by the providence of Christ, to whom belongs all glory, honor, power, greatness and magnificence, now and always and until the end of time.

... and his sister composed his remains. She put them in a basket and sewed I up, as he had instructed her before his death. And when she found the opportunity, she took shp and came to the city of Alexandria, bringing with her the holy Apa Mena's remains. When she came off the ship, the people of the city came forth to meet her. They did homage to the holy Apa Mena's remains. The Alexandrians took his holy body and prepared it for burial decently. They undertook the building of a shrine as a resting place for his body in the city of Alexandria. And it was not God's pleasure that his body should remain in the city of Alexandria but that He should bring it to the place which He had appointed for it. And the angel of the Lord appeared to the archbishop, saying to him, "Take the blessed Apa Mena's body. Put it on a camel. Do not let anyone lead it. Set it free to walk by itself as far as the place where it kneels. Build the saint a shrine

there." When the archbishop rose in the morning, he had the camel brought and had the holy Apa Men's body placed on it. It was let go. It made its way by itself into the desert unaccompanied by man, till it reached a place called Libya Nepaeiat (in the Mareotis region, SW of Alexandria). And, when it was in God's pleasure, the camel knelt in that place. And the people there took the blessed Apa Mena's body down from the camel. And they laid the foundations of a tomb. They built it in a befitting manner. They placed his holy body in it. They placed it in a crypt. It has remained there till the present day.

And the Savior fulfilled all that He had said to the holy Apa Mena and all that he had promised him. And all who suffer from any kind of illness, and the blind and the lame and those possessed with devils, when they come and do reverence before his holy body, receive healing forthwith.

All do not realize with equal seriousness the great significance for our spiritual life of meditation on the Lives of the Saints. Some go so far as to say, 'I have the Gospels; I have Christ---I need no intermediaries.' Some do not actually utter these self-assured words, but on the other hand neither do they appeal to the Saints during periods of spiritual depression (and who has not had such experiences?) For what is a Saint? A man like ourselves, but one who, having followed the right path, has found that which we all seek--God. Why, then, should we not study them and follow their example? It is required that not only with the body should we fast, but with the soul. Now the soul is humbled when it does not follow wicked opinions, but feeds on becoming virtues. For virtues and vices are the food of the soul, and it can eat either of these two. Bend your appetite toward virtues, as Paul says, "Being nourished by the word of truth." *St. Athanasios of Alexandria*

Truly great and mighty is the power of God's word. For the word of God has changed "the offspring of vipers" into children of God. So let us constantly sow it within the hard soil of our heart, waiting for it to soften it so that the wheat-ear of life may sprout up in it. For the word of God is at the same time the seed and the water; and even though we have a heart like stone, it will be softened and split up by the water of the Spirit, so that it can bring forth holy fruit that is pleasing to God. *Martyrius*, 7th century

On days when a Saint is celebrated, Christians ought to pray more ardently, with contrition and love, and entreat the Saint to intercede with God for the salvation of their soul. The feast day of every Saint is for Christians a serious reminder of the great sufferings which the Saints experienced for the sake of Christ's faith. They were glorified by God and with glory they received a place in the Kingdom of Heaven. *St. Raphael of Lesvos*

A Special Reminder for your priest:

A man should know that a devil's sickness is on him if he is seized by the urge in conversation to assert his opinion, however correct it may be. If he behaves this way while talking to his equals, then a rebuke from his elders may heal him. But if he carries on in this way with those who are greater and wiser than he, his sickness cannot be cured by human means. *St. John Climacus*
