## The Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God

**Luke 6:31-36:** And just as you want men to do to you, you also do to them likewise. But if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same? And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive back, what credit is that to you? For even sinners lend to sinners to receive as much back. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, hoping for nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most *High. For He is kind to the unthankful and evil. Therefore be merciful, just as your Father also is merciful.* 

The Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God is celebrated throughout the world today. Serious minds turn to the Mother of God in thought, prayer and with reverence. The Mother of God is greatly honored in God's Holy Church

Serious believers are grateful for the attentiveness of the Mother of God. Believers regularly turn to the Mother of God in prayer as part of the Divine services of the Church. Believers are convinced of her attentiveness to prayer.

The Church has recorded miracles involving the Mother of God through the centuries. The miracle at the wedding of Cana recorded in the Gospel of St. John involved the Mother of God interceding with the Lord Jesus Christ.(Jn.2:`1-11)

Believers cherish the purity exemplified in the Mother of God. Her words of obedience are recorded in the Gospel of St. Luke: "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word."Lk.1:38)

Believers do well to follow the example of Mary and say with consistency to the Lord: "Let it be according to Your word." Believers do well to follow the example of Mary as expressed in song when she is described as "most pure."

Christians benefit from studying the relationship between the Mother of God and the Lord Jesus Christ. Inexhaustible lessons exist in learning how to personally approximate the unity existing between the Theotokos and Christ.

Believers seeking to grow in Christ devote time in prayer to the Mother of God. Believers seeking to repent of sins seek the assistance and intercession of the Mother of God. Believers turn to the Mother of God seeking solutions to problems.

Prayers to the Mother of God are rich in content and extensive in addressing a range of personal needs and circumstances. The Church's prayers to the Mother of God enable believers to clearly express interests of the heart, mind and soul.

Miraculous icons of the Mother of God have appeared in diverse and distant locations. Miraculous icons of the Mother of God are sources of wonder, healing and protection.

On this Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God, believers gather in churches and monasteries. Some monasteries and churches have taken this feast as the Patronal Feast and celebrate with added dimensions of joy. The Mother of God is a source of joy as she was chosen among all women of all centuries to give birth to the Christ Child. She holds a unique place in salvation history that no other woman holds.

Belief in the Virgin birth of Christ is professed at baptism and each Divine Liturgy. The Virgin birth is recorded in the Gospel of St.

Luke.(Lk.1:1-2:20) The Virgin birth was forecast centuries earlier in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.(Is.7:14)

Centuries have passed since the birth of the Mother of God. Centuries have passed since her physical departure from this life. She continues to have an immeasurable presence in the lives of believers.

The Mother of God has transcended the time since her earthly physical life came to an end. Believers still communicate with her through prayer. Reports of her presence are recorded in the writings of the Church.

The Mother of God holds a particularly special understanding with respect to the Holy Mountain of Athos. Females are not permitted to visit the monasteries on Mt. Athos. The Mother of God is viewed as the guardian of Mt. Athos.<sup>1</sup>

Believers' minds are challenged to consider the far-reaching nature of the influence, presence and miracles of the Mother of God. Believers' minds do well to consider the lessons to be learned from the Mother of God.

Seeking to understand more about the Mother of God is part of the process of learning more about Christ and growing in Christ. No one has had a closer relationship with Christ than the Mother of God.

The Mother of God was chosen from all women of all centuries to give birth to the Christ Child. She was present at the Cross when Christ was being crucified. She was entrusted by Christ to the care of St. John the Apostle.(Jn.19:26-27)

The current Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God is traced to October 1, 911, when the Mother of God appeared in the Blachernae Church of the Mother of God in Constantinople. Her protection is viewed as unceasing.<sup>ii</sup>

God's Holy Church celebrates the life and miracles of the Mother of God throughout the year. Special observances occur in the Church on particular dates but the Mother of God is always a part of the liturgical life of the Church.

Believers find joy, comfort and hope when turning to the Mother of God in prayer and worship. She is ever accessible and readily welcomes believers seeking her intercession before the Lord Jesus Christ.

What is beautiful and well-made belongs to the world and cannot comfort those who want to live a spiritual life. There is no wall that will not eventually be torn down. One soul is worth more than the entire world. What must we do for the soul? We must begin spiritual work. We must have only the right kind of concern. Christ will ask us what spiritual work we have accomplished, how we helped the world in spiritual matters. He will not ask what buildings we made. He will not even mention them. We will be held accountable for our spiritual progress. I want you to grasp what I am trying to say. I am not saying that one must not construct buildings, and not construct them well, but one must take care of the spiritual life first and then mind the rest, and do all that with spiritual discernment. *Elder Paisios of the Holy Mountain, Athos* 

If you are not willing to repent through freely choosing to suffer, unsought sufferings will providentially be imposed on you. *St. Thalassios* (7th century)

To express , as is her due, the honor of the Virgin Bride, she did not just act as a mediator for certain chosen races; but - standing between God and every race of men - she made God the Son of man, and men the sons of God. She alone was shown to be the natural mother of God in a supernatural way; and, by her indescribable child-bearing, she became the Queen of the entire Creation --- in this world and beyond. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

It is fitting that [our Most Holy Theotokos] stands not just beside God, but on His right hand; for where Christ sat in Heaven, namely, on the right hand of the Majesty, there she now stands --- having ascended from earth to Heaven. Nor is this solely because no one longs for Christ as she does, and no one is so longed for in return --- which would be in accordance with the laws of nature; but because she is truly His throne. And where the King sits, there stands the throne. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

The Mother of God is so much closer to God than others who draw near to Him, that she is able to intercede more powerfully than any of them; and by this I mean not just human beings, but even all the ranks of angels. Isaiah [the Prophet] writes of the highest order of angels in heaven: 'And the Seraphim stood round about Him' (Isa. 6:2); whereas David says of the Mother of God: 'At Thy right hand stood the queen...' (Ps. 44[45]:8)...the Seraphim are 'round about' God, but only the Queen of all stands beside Him. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

At Thy right hand stood the queen, arrayed in a vesture of in-woven gold, adorned with various colors, as the Psalmist and Prophet says of [the Most Holy Theotokos] (*Ps. 44[45]:8*). And you should take this garment interwoven with gold to mean her divinely radiant body ---adorned with every type of virtue. For, at present, she is the only one who has a place in heaven with her divinely glorified body in the company of her Son. Earth, the grave and death could not ultimately detain her life-giving body, which has held God and been a more beloved habitation for Him than heaven and the heaven of heavens. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

All who know God, will know [the Mother of God/Panaghia/Theotokos] as the one who holds Him, Whom nothing can contain; and all who sing God's praises, will hymn her after God. She is the cause of what preceded her, the protectress of what comes after her, and she procures eternity. She is the Prophets' theme, the Apostles' starting point, the martyrs' mainstay, and the teachers' foundation. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

O Mother of God and Virgin ... you alone were vouchsafed the gifts of the Spirit in their totality, or rather, you alone held mysteriously in your womb, Him in Whom are the treasures of all these spiritual gifts; and became, inexplicably, His Tabernacle. ... You alone fulfilled all [the prophetic] visions, surpassing our human nature by means of your union with God; not just when you gave birth in a marvelous way, but also through the preceding fellowship with Him in everything good, which resulted from your utter purity. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

Who can tell of your mighty acts, O Virgin, or who can show forth all your praise, O holy Maid? You bear the title of Mother of God. You united your *nous* with God. You have joined God with flesh. You have made God the Son of Man, and man the Son of God. You have reconciled the world to its Creator. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

Just as it was only through [the Theotokos] that the Son came to us, was seen on earth and lived among men --- after previously being invisible to all, so from now on, for endless eternity: all progress towards the manifestation of divine light; every revelation of divine mysteries; and all forms of spiritual gifts are beyond everyone's grasp without her. She was the first to receive the all-pervading fullness of Him, Who fills all things; and she brought Him within reach of all - distributing to each as he is able to receive, in proportion to the measure of his purity - such that she is both the treasure-house and the mistress of God's riches. *St. Gregory Palamas* 

Avoid quarrels; by agitating the heart they deprive us of peaceful disposition of soul. Oppose all quarrelsome thoughts with the Jesus Prayer. *An Elder's Counsels to Christians Living in the World* 

Let's stop fighting and pray in a becoming way. We should put on the mildness of angels instead of the demons' brutality. No matter how we've been injured, we must soften our anger by considering our own case and our reward. Let us quiet the storms; we can pass through life calmly. Then, upon our departing, the Lord will treat us as we treated our neighbors. If this is a heavy, terrible thing to us, we must let Him make it light and desirable. What we don't have strength to carry out because of our struggle against sin, let us accomplish by becoming gentle to those who sinned against us. *St. John Chrysostom* 

God has created all people spiritually equal. Every person has the same propensity for good and evil. Every person has the same choice, as to whether to obey God or to defy Him. Yet in other ways, we are very unequal. Some people are highly intelligent, while others have feeble intellects. Some people are physically strong and healthy, while others are weak and prone to illness. Some people are handsome and attractive while others are plain. Those who are gifted in some way should not despise those less gifted. On the contrary, God has distributed gifts and blessings in such a way that every person has a particular place and purpose within a society--and thus everyone is equally necessary for a society to function well. So, do not resent the fact that someone is more intelligent or stronger than you are. Instead, give thanks for their intelligence and strength, from which you benefit. And then ask yourself, "What is my gift, and thence what is my place in society?" When you have answered this question, and you act according to your answer, all contempt and all resentment will melt away. St. John Chrysostom

Do not think that you have a right to complain when your prayers are not answered. God fulfills your desires in a manner that you do not know. *St. Nektarios the Wonderworker* 

To deny oneself means to give up one's bad habits; to root out of the heart all that ties us to the world; not to cherish bad thoughts and desires; to suppress every evil thought; to avoid occasions of sin; not to desire or to do anything out of self-love, but to do everything out of love for God. To deny oneself, according to St. Paul means "to be dead to sin. . . but alive to God." *St. Innocent of Alaska* 

The darkness which you have, my child, comes both from nature and from the tempter. Both are healed by the arrival of God's grace. For this reason, entreat God to give you sobriety and the ability to remember good things and forget bad things. When you persist, little by little the grace of God will help you. *Elder Ephraim of the Holy Mountain (Athos)* 

Let us follow our Good Master; let us shun worldly desires; let us shun the world of deceit and its temporal ruler; let us give ourselves in purity to our Maker; let us honor our image; let us respect our call and change our lives. Why do we debase ourselves when our origins are lofty? Why do we cling to the visible realm? *St. Gregory the Theologian* 

Truly, O Lord, if we do not humble ourselves, You do not cease to humble us. *St. Isaac the Syrian* from <u>Ascetical Homilies</u>

In this world, shipmates, sin that pays its way can travel freely, and without a passport; whereas Virtue, if a pauper, is stopped at all frontiers. --MOBY DICK, Chapter IX

Peaceful, night-time prayer is of great assistance with its calmness and is also more efficacious for our spiritual development, just as the silent, night-time rain is of great benefit to growing plants. Elder Paisios of the Holy Mountain Athos
