#### Statement of the Holy Eparchial Synod of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America

The Holy Eparchial Synod of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America in its Fall 2012 session expresses once again its deep concern over extremist language used in all spheres of public and private life. We exhort all the people with the admonition of the Holy Apostle Paul: Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one (Colossians 4:6). We deplore the use of any racist, xenophobic, fascistic, hateful speech, imagery and behavior. Noting that the one of the great gifts of living in a democracy is the right to free speech, we nevertheless commend responsibility, civility, and indeed love in choosing our words and modes of expression. The people of Greece said "NO" to fascism in World War II and consequently suffered tremendously under the Nazi occupation. We call upon all people to say "NO" to the hatefulness of all forms of totalitarianism and embrace the true philanthropy and philoxenia (love of the stranger) that is the message of the Gospel. As a leader in Interfaith and Inter-Cultural Dialogue, the Greek Orthodox Church, by the grace of God, prays and works for peace, respect, and reconciliation among all people.

What is the cause of temptations, what is the benefit thereof, and what are their different kinds [Part 18 of 33]

"The mercy of God is wondrously concealed in involuntary sufferings, drawing to repentance him who patiently endures them; and delivering him from eternal chastisement. If it is not easy to find someone who has been pleasing to God without tribulations, then we should thank God for all that happens to us. If Peter had not failed to catch fish by night, he would not have succeeded in catching fish by day [Luke 5:5]. If Paul had not been physically blinded, he would not subsequently have gained his spiritual vision [Acts 9:8]. And if Stephen had not been slandered as a blasphemer [Acts 6:13], he would not have beheld God when the Heavens were open to him [Acts 7:56]." Abba Mark

We should feel the malice of the other person as an illness which is tormenting him and which he is unable to shake off. And so we should regard our brethren with sympathy and behave with courtesy towards them, repeating in our hearts with simplicity the prayer, 'Lord Jesus Christ,' so that the grace of God may strengthen our soul and so that we don't pass judgment on anyone.

We should regard all people as saints. We all carry within us the same 'old self.' Our neighbor, whoever he is, is 'flesh of our flesh,' he is our

brother and, according to St. Paul, we owe no one anything, except to love one another. We can never pass judgment on others, for no one ever hated his own flesh. Elder Porphyrios, **Wounded by Love**, pp. 182
