Sickness and Pain are a Gift of God: St. Panteleimon Comes to the Aid of Monk Daniel



In the Kalyva of Saint Chrysostomos of the Skete of Koutloumousiou of the Monastery of Saint Panteleimon on Mount Athos, there lived years ago Monk Daniel who for 20 years was sick and had headaches and backaches, kidney and heart problems, leg problems and pain sometimes throughout his entire body.

Many times he travelled to doctors and received numerous X-ray examinations and radiographies, but the outcome was always the same. The doctors could not find any physical explanation for his sickness. Yet Monk Daniel continued to suffer his sicknesses and there was not a physician or scientist to be found that could help him.

One 27th of July, during the vigil of Saint Panteleimon, brother Daniel prayed with tears in his eyes and pleaded with Saint Panteleimon saying: "Saint of God and protector of our Skete, you who are a physician and for the love of Christ was martyred and spilled your blood, show your love and plead to the Master Christ to grant me health, so that with health I could glorify His name and psalmodize during the vigils."

Having said this, Monk Daniel grew a bit tired and took some sleep. He then in a vision saw Saint Panteleimon kneeling before the throne of God pleading for the health of Daniel. Monk Daniel heard the Master Christ say to Saint Panteleimon: "My brother Great-Martyr Panteleimon, do you think you are more compassionate than me? Do you think you love humanity more than me? I understand that out of love for me you spilled your blood, but did I not also spill mine and daily spill my blood for the salvation of people's souls? Learn that it is my will in which it happens many times for the body to suffer in order for the soul to be saved. This is how I want many people to be saved."

When brother Daniel heard this he awoke and glorified the name of God, thanked Saint Panteleimon for his effort and mediation, and immediately, as the same monk related, a great burden was lifted off of him and related that we must endure with patience, joy and thanksgiving the cross and situation of our sicknesses.

Through the prayers of the Holy Great Martyr and Healer Panteleimon, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us! Amen!

The Lord says to His disciples, **'Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven' (Matt. 5:16)**. He does not say this to urge them to show off, but to urge them to organize their lives as is pleasing to God. Just as light effortlessly attracts people's gaze, so a way of life pleasing to God draws their minds along with their eyes. We do not praise the air which shares in the brilliance of the sunlight, but the sun which is the source of this brilliance and bestows it on us. Even if we do praise the air for its brightness, we praise the sun much more. So it is when someone makes the brilliance of the Sun of righteousness (Mal. 4:2) visible through his virtuous deeds. As soon as anyone looks at him, they are immediately led towards the glory of the Father in heaven of Christ, the Sun of righteousness.

The Seventh Sunday after Pentecost Matthew 9:27-35

And when Jesus departed thence, two blind men followed Him, crying, and saying, Thou son of David, have mercy on us. And when He was come into the house, the blind men came to Him: and Jesus saith unto them, Believe ye that I am able to do this? They said unto Him, Yea, Lord. Then touched He their eyes, saying, According to your faith be it unto you. And their eyes were opened; and Jesus straitly charged them, saying, See that no man know it. But they, when they were departed, spread abroad His fame in all that country. As they went out, behold, they brought to Him a dumb man possessed with a devil. And when the devil was cast out, the dumb spake: and the multitudes marvelled, saying, It was never so seen in Israel. But the Pharisees said, He casteth out devils through the prince of the devils. And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people.(KJV)

How many people afflicted with various concerns and illnesses turn to the Lord Jesus Christ first and foremost for healing? How many experiencing emotional pain in their lives go far from God's Church in search of healing? Jesus restores sight to the blind and speech to the person unable to speak in the current Gospel. The current Gospel states Jesus healed every sickness and disease among the people.

Readers of the lives of the saints learn of innumerable healings through the centuries. Jesus told the blind men in the current Gospel: "According to your faith be it unto you."(Mt.9:29)

Readers of Revelation learn that being lukewarm is perilous.(Rev.3:16) Athletes making a lukewarm attempt in their efforts do not become victorious.

Christians lukewarm in their love of Christ deny themselves full joy in Christ.

Being a Christian requires constant investment in the Kingdom of God. Being a Christ involves unrelenting vigilance in protecting the heart, the soul and the mind.

The Church teaches believers ways to invest in the Kingdom of God. The Lord Jesus Christ's teachings are very clear about prayer, fasting and charitable works.

Practicing forgiveness is a way to invest in the Kingdom of God. The Lord's Prayer teaches that God's forgiveness of individuals is connected with the individual's forgiveness of others.

Loving family members, co-workers and friends as Christ would have them to be loved is an investment in the Kingdom of God. The current Gospel reading verifies that Christ preached in various locations about the Kingdom.

The degree of a person's faith in God is reflected in the way the person lives daily life. Faith increases the more it is practiced. Faith increases as a person learns more about Christ.

The soul of each person hungers for the authentic experience with Christ. The authentic experience with Christ is best found in God's Holy Church. The soul is most satisfied when experiencing Christ in Holy Communion.

The soul is satisfied in fervent prayer. The soul is nourished in hearing and reading the Holy Gospel. The soul is joyful when the believers loves the people in his or her personal life. The miraculous healing power of Christ described in the Holy Gospel is for real. God's Church has countless records of healings. Visible evidence of healings exists when wheelchairs and walkers are discarded at holy places.

Believers make pilgrimages to holy monasteries in search of healing. Believers act on their faith in God and travel great distances to find healing for personal problems. God does not disappoint individuals traveling in great faith.

Believers do well to think carefully and extensively about personal faith in God. Believers do well to personally examine the depths and basis for personal faith.

The love of God is within reach of each person. The healing power of God is within reach of each person. The heart and mind need to welcome the healing power of Christ. The heart and mind need to reject any personal bitterness.

The Psalmist said: "And the heavens shall praise thy wonders, O Lord: thy faithfulness also in the congregation of the saints."(Ps.88/89:5) The healing power of Christ is experienced in the Divine services of the Church.

Distractions in life can take a person far from the Kingdom of God. Unintended occurrences can interrupt efforts to seek the Kingdom of God. Christians need to be resolute in faith and commitment.

From the time of Holy Baptism until the time of departure from this life,

being faithful to the Lord Jesus Christ is expected. When a person sins, repentance restores the unity with Christ.

Repentance is a return and redirection of life toward the Kingdom of God.

Individuals benefit when recognizing the value of turning to God for help and direction in life.

The blind men reached out to Christ in the current Gospel. The Lord Jesus Christ heard the blind men's pleas for mercy. Church services contain many pleas for mercy from the Lord God.

Today is the day to seek the mercy of God. Every day is the day to reach out to the Lord God for healing and mercy. Each person is in need of constant cleansing of sins. January 17 · Corinna Wengryn Caudill "Prayer of a Lemko Woman" by the late Kateryna Rusyn, a cultural icon of Lemkos in Ukraine, a respected teacher and intellectual, and an accomplished poet/writer. So glad we got the honor of meeting Pani Kateryna and getting to know her. When she was a young child, Kateryna Lazoryshyn and her family were deported by Soviets/communist Poles from the Lemko village of Strubowiska in the Lesko Powiat (county) of the eastern Lemko region, which was a hotbed of Ukrainian-Polish internecine warfare in the years following World War II. Her words are still timely as many Lemko descendants in Ukraine suffer under the Russian occupation in eastern and southern Ukraine.

"Prayer of a Lemko Woman" by Kateryna Lazoryshyn Rusyn

O God, give me the strength to live through this day and help me to survive in this foreign land where they have brought me and my children.

O Lord, I pray and beseech Thee, let me not perish, nor my family, nor my people, who were late to sow the holy grain; for the corn will ripen in the summer and they know not when or how it will be gathered.

O Merciful God, may the sun rise and set each day, so that it brings light to all people and me, in the same way as it set each evening, there, far away, in the Beskyd Mountains, in my native hills and valleys; and may rye and every kind of seed grow for us, so that by winter we all have bread and hay and every grain to feed the people, the birds and the cattle.

O All-Highest Lord, let us not forget - neither today, nor tomorrow, nor ever - and help us to keep alive in our memory all the beauty of our land, of the mountains, and of the rich, healing and pure waters in our rivers: the Bystry, the Poprad, and the Syan (San); and let us also remember the fair and lovely country of the high pastures, and the woodland paths through the hills; let us not forget the places of plenty in the forest where the mushrooms grow, and the fragrant strawberries, blackberries, blueberries and raspberries, and the woodland clearings where the cattle graze.
