DEP Encourages Winterizing of Homes

With colder, winter weather on the way, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is encouraging residents to stay safe and warm this winter by winterizing their homes which can keep you warmer while using less energy and costing less money. The DEP offers the following tips to keep your home running efficiently:

• Set back the thermostat. Each degree lowered can save up to 3 percent on heating. A programmable thermostat, which cost as little as \$20 at a local hardware store, can be programmed to be setback automatically at designated timeframes, saving you more energy and money.

• Clean warm-air registers, baseboard heaters, and radiators regularly and make sure they are not blocked by furniture, carpeting or drapes.

• Weather-strip windows and exterior doors where you can feel air leakage. Check the bottom of the door to see if there is a gap. If there is a gap of a quarter inch or more, significant air can flow in and out of the house. Install a door sweep on the bottom of the door. Weather-stripping for the windows and doors is available in foam, rubber, vinyl and metal. For homes without storm windows, consider purchasing a window insulator kit. Install insulating drapes or curtains for windows that still feel drafty after weatherizing.

• Use the sunlight to heat your home by opening the curtains on southfacing windows during sunny days and close all curtains at night.

• Check the door to the attic to make sure it seals well and closes tightly. Some manufacturers make insulated attic covers.

• Do not heat unused spaces, other than as needed to prevent freezing of pipes. Close vents in unused rooms.

• If you have a wood stove, be sure to clean the flue vent and inside of the stove regularly.

• If you have a fireplace, reduce heat loss from the fireplace by keeping the damper closed. Install tempered glass and a heat-air exchange system that blows warmed air back into the room. Check the seal on the fireplace damper and ensure it is snug and add caulking around the hearth. It is a good idea to have a carbon monoxide monitor as well.

If you have a furnace, have it checked by a heating professional. This will make the unit more efficient and provide peace of mind that it is running safely. A heating professional should check the exhaust flue and

venting to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning. Be sure to replace the air filter as directed to keep the air in your home clean and the unit running well. A properly maintained furnace can result in a 10 percent reduction in fuel consumption.

Winter Mission Trip Fundraising Announcement

If anyone had asked me ten years ago if I would consider being a Christian missionary, I am not sure what my answer would have been at that time. If after such an unsure response, I would have been told that in the next few years I would have participated in four mission trips (two domestic and two international), I might have been surprised. However, after participating in various missions, I have been asked if I would consider returning or going on other trips to serve. Since my first four trips, my answer to this question is: "God-willing."

Each mission trip increased a tugging feeling at my heart to seek ways to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20). Deep inside of me, I never felt that I wouldn't go on another mission, but rather that it would be a matter of time when God would reveal the proper circumstances for me to actively participate in another mission trip. That tugging feeling in my heart is why I recently applied for another mission to the orphanages in Ukraine. As it would seem, God has blessed this opportunity for me, and I was accepted to join the mission team!

This mission trip will take place December 20-27, 2015. I will be traveling with seven other team members and His Grace Bishop Daniel, of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in the U.S.A. We will be visiting one orphanage in Znamyanka where there are approximately 110 children who experience various levels of physical and mental disabilities. Children living in the orphanage have suffered substantial trauma in their lives. These children, who have been orphaned, physically limited, and abandoned, benefit from as much love and attention as the mission teams can give them! For children who have spent most of their lives experiencing nothing but rejection, feeling unique and special is a critical part of their healing process. They have a special need to feel loved, wanted, cherished, and cared for. While on this trip, we will be able to offer assistance in basic care

for the children; take daily walks with the children in wheel chairs; complete possible repairs, construction and painting of murals at the orphanage; and work on basic therapeutic / educational projects with the children.

I was blessed to visit this orphanage twice in college on two separate trips. The second trip, I was able to become the Godmother of a child there, who, God-willing, I will be able to reconnect with for the first time since her baptism.

I would appreciate your prayers and support as I go on this trip. This will be a life changing experience and having your support will make it a success. Please prayerfully consider how you may possibly support me in this humble attempt to serve our Lord and His children. The cost for the trip is \$2500 plus additional travel per person. Cost includes airfare, travel within Ukraine, food, housing, visa costs, and materials for the orphanages. Any money collected above this amount will be used for additional trip expenses or given to the orphanages on my behalf. If you are unable to help me financially, please keep the team and me in your prayers – especially during these turbulent times.
