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Divided and distributed is the Lamb of God: who is divided yet not disunited; who is ever eaten, yet never consumed, but sanctifying those who partake thereof. (from Divine Liturgy—division of the Lamb into four parts prior to placing them on the paten/diskos)

A woman came out of her house and saw 3 old men with long white beards sitting in her front yard. She did not recognize them. She said: "I don't think I know you, but you must be hungry. Please come in and have something to eat."

"Is the man of the house home?? they asked.

"No", she replied. "He's out."

"Then we cannot come in", they replied.

In the evening when her husband came home, she told him what had happened.

"Go tell them I am home and invite them in."

The woman went out and invited them in.

"We do not go into a house together," they replied.

"Why is that?" she asked.

One of the old men explained: "His name is Wealth," he said pointing to one of his friends, and said pointing to another one, "He is Success, and I am Love." Then he added, "Now go in and discuss with your husband which one of us you want in your home."

The woman went in and told her husband what was said. Her husband was overjoyed. "How nice", he said. "Since that is the case, let us invite Wealth. Le him come and fill our home with wealth!" His wife disagreed "My dear, why don't we invite Success?" Their daughter-in-law was listening from the other corner of the house. She jumped in with her own suggestion: "Would it not be better to invite Love? Our home will then be filled with love!"

"Let us heed our daughter-in-law's advice," said the husband to his wife. "Go out and invite Love to be our guest."

The woman went out and asked the 3 old men, "Which one of you is Love? Please come in and be our guest."

Love got up and started walking toward the house. The other 2 also got up and followed him. Surprised the lady asked Wealth and Success: "I only invited Love. Why are you coming in?"

The old men replied together: " If you had invited Wealth or Success, the other two of us would've stayed out, but since you invited Love, wherever He goes, we go with Him. Wherever there is Love, there is also Wealth and Success!!!!"

The Orthodox Church surpasses all other Christian groups in the richness of her Tradition. The Protestants want only to adhere to Holy Scripture. But Holy Scripture cannot be interpreted outside of Tradition. The Apostle Paul himself commands: Therefore, brethren, stand fast and hold the traditions which you have been taught, whether by word or our epistle (2 Thessalonians 2:15). The tradition of Prince Abgar, without doubt, is of Apostolic Tradition, even though the apostles do not mention him in their

writings. The Apostle Thaddaeus did not write anything at all (and according to Protestant thinking, that would mean he did not say anything and or teach the faithful). According to what, then, was he an apostle of Christ? St. John Damascene [Damaskin] cites the tradition of Prince Abgar in his defense of the veneration of icons. How wonderful and touching is the letter of Abgar to Christ! He wrote, first of all, that he had heard of His miraculous power--that Christ cured the sick. Then he implored Him to come and to heal him, and continued on to say: "I also hear that the Jews hate You, and that they are preparing some evil against You. I have a city, not large, but beautiful and bountiful in every good; come to me and live with me in my city, which is sufficient for the both of us for every need." Thus wrote a heathen prince, while the princes of Jerusalem were preparing death for the Lord, the Lover of Mankind.(Reflection from the Prologue)

"...you have to find ways in your city or town, in your immediate area to not only connect with people but to bring them to an encounter with Orthodoxy. That's a huge challenge for a mission priest, especially one in the middle of a Southern Baptist area." (Fr Alexis Baldwin, Orthodox mission priest in South Carolina, interview)

As baptism is a Mystery of entry into the Church, the three opening prayers are done at the back of the church building, as part of a formal (and literal) entrance into the church.

The first prayers are "The Exorcism Prayers" where the priest calls upon the Holy Spirit to expel Satan and all his angels from the presence of the candidate for baptism. He prays that the spirits of evil may not lay hold of him/her by temptation or any other torment. The priest blows on the candidate cross-wise three times to symbolize the exorcising power of the Holy Spirit—the Hebrew and Greek words for "spirit" also mean "breath."

The second prayer is "The Renunciation of Satan." The candidate and sponsors turn to face the west, the entrance of the church. West is symbolic of darkness, since the sun sets the west. through this movement the devil, the "lord of darkness", is

confronted and rejected, along with "and all his works, all his worship, all his angels, and all his pomp."

The final prayer is "The Acceptance of Christ". Turning back to face the east, towards the Altar, symbolizing the Light of Christ, the candidate and sponsors accept Jesus "as King and as God." They affirm this acceptance by repeating the words of the Nicene Creed. (St. Nektaros)

In the Orthodox Church, Monday is remembered as the Day of the Angels. Scripture is filled with stories of angels. We are told that angels are "ministering servants" and are here to help us. Instead of dreading Monday, we ought to begin Monday with a remembrance that we are not alone - our prayers and praises are part of a vast chorus that fills the universe and beyond. Nor do we dwell alone. We are watched and guarded by the good God who created us, and by His angels that surround us.

"Holy Archangels and Angels, pray to God for us."

It is better to be friends with animals than with people of this world. If after God, you want to have a true friend, then make friends with the saints. If you do not have saints as friends, then be friends with wild animals. Saint Paisios
