# Holy Trinity - F71 + + The Community of Love + +

We all live in many levels of community: our family, our friends, our teachers and schools, our neighbors, our city, our state, our country, and our world. Some are voluntary, and some are given, but all of them affect us, shape us, and provide a place to relate to others in a meaningful way if we choose to do so. These levels of community may be pleasant, helpful, and enlivening or can be the opposite, but they are not always by nature a community of love. How we relate to others is a way to learn to love others as ourselves, the second of Christ's great commandments. Here we can learn respect, care, listening, affirmation, compassion, and many other noble traits. Through practice, these can become a way of living, knowing, and thinking. It is the practice in accepting others who are the most different from us that is both the most challenging, but can then become the most rewarding. This is a process of learning to love.

There is one place, however, where we can join and live in and be nourished most directly by a community of love. That community although present in every place and every time, also was before all time and place, for it is an eternal community, whose very definition is love itself. This is the community of the Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Creation is an extension of their love to bring the mutual respect and love present in the Trinity before time and place to all those people who wish to join in living there through grace in a Trinitarian way. We were made to be included and to flourish in this great community of love. The Monastics at St. Isaac of Syria Skete and at the Convent of St. Silouan

High atop a monastery on Holy Mt. Athos there lived an abbot whose monastery suffered from constant gossiping and guarreling among the brother monks. A good and faithful servant of the Lord, the abbot was greatly troubled by this dilemma and sought to bring an end to this strife. To bring resolution to this increasingly divisive situation, he entrusted his spiritually ailing community to the care of one of the elders, bid farewell to the monks and ventured off on a journey to a thriving monastery, the health of which was attributed to the leadership of its wise and discerning abbot. Upon approaching the humble cell of the brotherhood's luminary abbot, the troubled abbot prayed fervently that the meeting would render some sign of answer to bring back to his distraught community. Sitting for some time, the distraught abbot explained to the spiritual father, in great detail, the nature of the discord plaguing his flock. Listening patiently and intently the latter responded thus, "Your situation sounds grave, but with much sadness I am afraid that I must confess to you that I have no advice or guidance to give to you. However, there is one thing that I think you should know. At your monastery there lives a saint among the monks." Astonished by this revelation, the abbot returned immediately to his flock and reported these words. In no time a strange thing happened. Not knowing who among them might be a saint, the brothers began to look at one another in a new and more loving manner. They began to be kind to one another in a way the abbot never thought possible and, although the saint in question was never revealed, a miracle did happen: harmony and love were restored to the life of that Christian community. —Author Unknown

# Mother Prioress Fevroniya - The Holy Zeal - 1921-2015

Mother Fevroniya (Born Petra) was born in 1921 in Kingdom of Yugoslavia, town Brčko in north-east Bosnia, in a very pious Serbian Orthodox family. She became nun at the age of 19. She spent her entire life, 75 years as nun, in a struggle against Croat Ustashe, German NAZIs, Albanian Radical Islamists and Godless Communists, to preserve Monastery Peć's

Patriarchate, the ancient throne of Serbian Orthodox Patriarchs, that is now surrounded by aggressive Albanian Muslim population. When she became Prioress of Peć's Patriarchate, monastery was in complete ruins, she and her 6 nuns restored the monastery during the dark era of communism in Yugoslavia. Mother Fevroniya was inspired by saint Sava, first Serbian Archbishop, who created Serbian Orthodox Church by gaining independence from the Constantinople's Patriarchate in 1217. Mother Fevroniya was interviewed only 35 days before she passed away in 19th December, 2015, as one of oldest Nuns in the Belgrade Patriarchate. She was known for her beautiful old school zeal she had for God and His Orthodox Church.

# How do you return to God? From the teachings of Pope Shenouda

Prayer is the means of returning to God. Pour out your heart before God, and say to Him: "O' Lord,I want You, I want to come back to You. Please rescue me from my state, and draw me back to you once again.

Without You I am nothing. When I lost You, I lost my life, I lost my happiness and delight. I lost my strength when I went far away from You. Please give me the divine assistance to help me to return to You.

Cast yourself before the Lord, and wrestle with Him, and say to Him: "I shall not get up from here unless I have received Your special blessing, and feel that You have taken me back and count me among Your Children. I don't just want You to forgive my sin, I want You to remove from my heart any love of sin, once and for all.

I can't come back to You, if there is any love of sin in my heart. So I come to You with my sin, just as I am. You are the one who can take it from me. You can lead me in the procession of Your victory.

# The Sunday of All Saints Matthew 10:32-33, 37-38, 19:27-30

Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven. He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me. Then answered Peter and said unto him, Behold, we have forsaken all, and followed thee; what shall we have therefore? And Jesus said unto them, Verily I say unto you,

That ye which have followed me, in the regeneration when the Son of man shall sit in the throne of his glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life. But many that are first shall be last; and the last shall be first.(KJV)

The current Gospel emphasizes the importance of Christ being first in our lives. At Holy Baptism we are completely dedicated to the Lord Jesus Christ. Our full body is immersed and anointed.

Belief in the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed is professed at Holy Baptism.

Satan is renounced. The Baptismal service changes a person. A new and complete identity in Christ is established.

Baptism put the person on the road to the Kingdom of God for the balance of earthly life. Efforts and goals of life are to be consistent with the Gospel. Life is to be lived in ways pleasing to Christ.

Christ is the source of nourishment for life. Christ is the basis of learning for life. Christ is the goal of life. Christ is the intended love of life. All that is not of Christ is unnecessary.

If Christ is first in our lives, our thoughts and actions correspond to the way of Christ. When Christ is first in life, the rest of life is in the proper place. Believers are to pick up personal crosses in life and go forth with Christ.

The current Gospel makes clear that believers are to confess Christ. Confessors of Christ show their love of Christ in the way daily life is lived. The Lord Jesus Christ said:" Ye shall know them by their fruits."(Mt.7:16)

Today is the Sunday of All Saints. The saints are completely committed to Christ. The saints' commitment to Christ lives on long after their departure from earthly life.

The saints show the various possibilities of being faithful to Christ. The saints show their love of Christ has enabled them in many instances to overcome great hardships.

The lives of the saints are instructive examples to be studied. The saints offer lasting instructive lessons in faith. Much time may pass before the lasting lessons of certain saints are revealed.

We know from the Gospel "Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid." (Mt.5:14) Benefits exist in being mindful of the prayers of ascetics living in remote areas.

The desert fathers and saintly ascetics from Mt. Athos and Meteora inspire and teach individuals seeking to learn more about the prayerful life. Saints teach about the rigors of prayer.

Prayer is work. Greet effort is required to pray consistently and extensively. To benefit greatly from prayer, belief in the value of prayer and the attentiveness of God are required.

The saints' lives reveal works practiced anonymously for the benefit of many people. God has a way of multiplying the benefit of works done in anonymity.(Mt.6:4)

The Sunday of All Saints follows Pentecost Sunday every year in the Church's liturgical calendar. The Church determines there is value in celebrating the Sunday of All Saints throughout the world.

Newness exists each year with the arrival of All Saints Sunday. Believers celebrating Pascha, Ascension and Pentecost are exposed to different paths to Christ when celebrating the Sunday of All Saints.

The differences existing in the lives of the saints are connected in the common bond with Christ. The saints' love of Christ and commitment to Christ are the common bond of unity.

Today let us rejoice in celebrating the lives of the saints. Let us ponder the countless saints through the centuries. Their lives and intercessory prayers have enriched the world beyond measure.

Life is enriched when time is taken to learn more about individual saints.

Joy emanates from the lives of saints having repented of sins and become totally new in Christ.

Individuals will find in the lives of the saints models for use in daily life. Saints having overcome great hardships offer hope for individuals in dire circumstances.

The Sunday of All Saints radiates Christ throughout the world. The Church enriches believers' lives with this celebration each year. Let us give thanks abundantly for the Sunday of All Saints and the accompanying blessings.

## From Coffee with Sister Vassa--(Tuesday, May 2)

"Do not work on the food (ἐργάζεσθε μὴ τὴν βρῶσιν) which perishes, but on the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of man will give to you; for on him has God the Father set his seal.' Then they said to him, 'What must we do, to be working the works (ἐργαζώμεθα τὰ ἕργα) of God?' Jesus answered them, 'This is the work of God (τὸ ἕργον τοῦ θεοῦ), that you believe in him whom he has sent.'" (Jn 6: 27-29)

So, believing in Christ, Whom the Father has sent, is "work." More specifically, it is "the work" of God, in us. For our part, it involves "working on the food which endures to eternal life," or seeing to our spiritual nourishment.

What does this mean for me on this cloudy Tuesday, in practical terms? It means staying close to God's word, and staying, prayerfully, in His presence, so that the rest of my "work" can fall into the right place. So I remain sane and healthy, doing what I am supposed to be doing, according to my "vocation," rather than losing focus or balance, and slipping into obsessions or addictions. "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well." (Mt 6: 33) Lord, be my focus today, so that all my work may be Your work, in me. Amen!
