STATEMENT ON THE SEPARATION OF CHILDREN FROM THEIR PARENTS AT THE USA-MEXICO BORDER

Recently, in reference to the ongoing controversy of separating children from their parents who have illegally crossed the border into the United States of America, our government officials on several levels quoted from Holy Scripture the following: "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God." (Romans 13:1)

This quote has, as far as we have been able to determine, been utilized only twice before in the history of our United States of America—by the defenders of the British Crown during the Revolutionary War and then by the defenders of slavery during the Civil War. Neither in the present instance nor in the previous two instances will one hear other quotes from Scripture that declare that submission to civil authorities is mandatory only as long as those authorities promote good works rather than acting in opposition to God. When the civil authorities are in direct opposition to God, the believer must follow God. (Acts 4:19 and 5:29)

At the outset, we wish to declare that we believe it extremely important to protect the borders of our nation and to do everything possible to make entry into our great nation as peaceful, legal and beneficial to all. It is the history of our nation to be welcoming of immigrants who may wish to come to us for a great variety of reasons. We are, however, moved to tears when we witness what has been taking place at our southern border where over 2000 children, including infants, have been taken away from

their parents and housed in cold abandoned super store warehouses with only the minimum of comfort and none of the affection and love of their parents.

We can describe this situation in no other way than inhumane and sinful. Our Holy Orthodox Faith very clearly teaches the value and sanctity of human life—that each and EVERY human being is created in the Image of God—to image God in the world where they live. When we hear the words spoken that "if we have no zero-tolerance effort such as the separation of children from parents who are being charged with illegal entry into the USA, then we will have an 'infestation' of illegal immigrants", we are confronted with the destruction of that image describing human beings in terms used for rodents or insects that must be made to disappear before they destroy us.

We are a better nation than this and this is seen in the reaction to the events described above. When "we the people" respond—including the media—to a wrong, our voice is heard. "We the people" are the foundation of our democracy and the guardians of our Faith. "We the people," after hearing for a week now the crying children and the ridicule of them, have made it clear that that we will stand for it no more. We had already concluded our statement earlier with other thoughts, but it has now come to our attention that the government has reversed its policy of separating children from their parents. Our voice has been heard and we are thankful to God in the Holy Trinity that this policy is gone. We would like to rejoice in this change because of a change of heart—or a coming to one's self (Prodigal Son)—had occurred. We see, however, simple political expedience, which implies no permanence of purpose.

We, as Ukrainians by heritage, are all too aware of such policies of family divisions, arrests and deportation for the slightest and mostly fabricated infractions, disappearance of loved ones, mass murders and death by forced starvation. We know the extremes to which unfettered power and authority can lead. We have maintained our faith through some of the worst examples of dehumanization. May we never lose sight of such wrongful history, but may we also never lose hope and faith in a better tomorrow where the LOVE of our Lord reigns forever.

May the Grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the Love of God the Father and the Fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all.

NEW YORK (June 18, 2018) – In recent days, the words of St. Paul in the 13th chapter of his Epistle to the Romans have been circulating in the news. We are concerned and alarmed at the use of this biblical quote being used out of context to justify the strict application of a policy occurring at our southern border, which is detrimental to family life.

The numerous challenges of today's world weaken the already strained bonds of every modern family. Family—a divine institution (cf. Ephesians

3:14)—is something that we as Orthodox Christians cherish and hold as sacred. Furthermore, when our Lord came into this world as a human being, he entered it as a child and part of a family. As a special creation of God the Father, no family deserves to be separated. The institution of the family is found from the beginning of the Book of Genesis (chapter 2). In love and harmony, the family finds joy, each member in the other. Reflecting this joy, the Psalmist proclaims, *your children will be like olive trees around your table* (Psalm 127/128:3b). Let us bear in mind that the branch of an olive tree is a universal symbol of peace, not something to be torn apart and broken.

It is for peace and for a dignified and humane solution to this unfortunate situation that we, together with people of good faith across our great nation, urgently entreat. Children should not, under any circumstances, be punished for things that are beyond their control. Our hearts go out to those suffering under these terrible conditions. We pray for them, that their families soon be restored, and pray that the proper authorities find a swift and just solution to this unfortunate and very painful situation.

The Fourth Sunday after Pentecost Matthew 8:5-13

And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, And saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. When Jesus heard it, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. And I say unto you, That many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weep ing and gnashing of teeth. And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour. (KJV)

The current Gospel comes to believers the Fourth Sunday after Pentecost each year. The Gospel is a lesson in strong faith. The Gospel demonstrates the concern of a centurion for his servant.

This can be a lesson in employer-employee relations. Each person hearing this Gospel reading does well to consider the strength of his or her personal faith. Steps to strengthen personal faith can be initiated as a result of the present Gospel.

Faith is strengthened by becoming more knowledgeable about God. Faith is strengthened by increasing familiarity with the documented healings in the Holy Scriptures.

Readers of Church history will find additional references to healings having taken place. Holy Confession heals the hearts, minds, and souls of believers. Holy Communion has a healing power for which there is no equal.

Holy Communion brings complete peace and joy to the believer. Holy Unction brings healing to the soul and to the body. The current Gospel will affect the minds of attentive listeners.

Attentive listeners will take direct action as a result of the present Gospel. The centurion's servant experienced not only physical afflictions but also mental torment.

How a person responds to physical afflictions depends on the person's faith and integrity of soul. Some individuals are at peace even when having horrific physical conditions.

Some individuals increase in faith and unity with Christ due to a serious medical condition. Individuals without faith and with no interest in faith may become despondent and negative about life when a physical affliction occurs.

Individuals strong in faith and at peace when having physical ailments are an inspiration and help to others. The actions a person takes when having a difficult physical condition will directly affect others.

In the present Gospel the centurion was moved to help his servant. The centurion reflects an attitude of concern. The centurion took the initiative to come to the Lord Jesus Christ for assistance.

He did not let the servant languish or suffer further without taking action. The centurion apparently had an element of hope and belief that the Lord Jesus Christ could heal his servant.

The Gospel does not mention what prior knowledge or understanding caused the centurion to approach Jesus. From his comment about authority, the centurion looked upon the Lord Jesus Christ as authoritative.

The centurion felt Jesus' word was sufficient to make a difference in the life of his servant. The Holy Gospel contains the known words of Jesus and has been making a difference in lives for centuries. Individuals taking the Gospel to heart have their lives changed and renewed beyond measure.

Jesus responded to the centurion's pleas. Jesus was direct and reassuring with the centurion. The centurion could have not expected a better response. The servant would be healed due to the pleading of the centurion and the mercy of God.

Individuals seeking healing do well to approach the Lord Jesus Christ in faith and in humility. An open and welcoming heart and a resoluteness of faith are beneficial when a believer draws closer to Christ seeking healing.

The Lord Jesus Christ has the power to heal whomever He chooses. Individuals seeking healing have a responsibility to bring their lives into line with the teachings, values, and standards of Christ. Individuals seeking healing have a responsibility to be willing to live in ways pleasing to Christ. Christ is due continuous gratitude when healings occur and prayers are answered.

The healing power of the Lord Jesus Christ merits a continuous place in the heart and mind of the believer. Believers need healing of the proclivity to sin. Believers need healing of soul and body.

Believers need the presence of hope when despondency, depression or despair make their presence felt. Christ's demonstrated and documented healing power provides a basis for the expectation of a believer's renewal.

Christ's healing power establishes enduring hope. If the blind man can receive his sight (Jn.9:1-38), if the centurion's servant can be healed, if the deaf can begin to hear and lepers are cleansed (Lk.7:22) there is always reason to hope.
