CATECHETICAL HOMILY OF OUR FATHER AMONG THE SAINTS, JOHN CHRYSOSTOM, ARCHBISHOP OF CONSTANTINOPLE



If any be devout and love God, let them enjoy this fair and radiant triumphal feast. If any be wise servants, let them rejoicing enter into the joy of their Lord. If any have laboured long in fasting, let them now receive their recompense.

If any have wrought from the first hour, let them today receive their just reward.

If any have come at the third hour, let them with thankfulness keep the feast.

If any have arrived at the sixth hour, let them have no misgivings, because they shall in nowise be deprived therefor.

If any have delayed until the ninth hour, let them draw near, fearing nothing.

If any have tarried even until the eleventh hour, let them, also, be not alarmed at their tardiness; for the Lord, who is jealous of His honour, will accept the last even as the first. He gives rest unto them who come at the eleventh hour, even as unto them who have wrought from the first hour.

And He shows mercy upon the last, and cares for the first; and to the one He gives, and upon the other He bestows gifts. And He both accepts

the deeds and welcomes the intention, and honours the acts and praises the offering.

Wherefore, enter you all into the joy of your Lord; and receive your reward, both the first and likewise the second. You rich and you poor together, hold high festival. You sober and you heedless, honour the day. Rejoice today, both you who have fasted and you who have disregarded the fast. The table is full-laden. Feast you all sumptuously. The calf is fatted. Let no one go hungry away.

Enjoy you all the feast of faith. Receive you all the riches of loving-kindness. Let none bewail their poverty, for the universal Kingdom has been revealed. Let none weep for their iniquities, for pardon has shown forth from the grave. Let none fear death, for the Saviour's death has set us free. He that was held prisoner of it has annihilated it. By descending into hell, He made hell captive. He embittered it when it tasted of His flesh. And Isaiah, foretelling this, did cry: "Hell," said he, "was embittered when it encountered Thee in the lower regions."

It was embittered, for it was abolished. It was embittered, for it was mocked. It was embittered, for it was slain. It was embittered, for it was overthrown. It was embittered, for it was fettered in chains. It took a body, and met God face to face. It took earth, and encountered Heaven. It took that which was seen, and fell upon the Unseen.

O death, where is your sting? O hell, where is your victory?
Christ is risen, and you are overthrown!
Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen!
Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice!
Christ is risen, and life reigns!

Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave! For Christ, being risen from the dead, has become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Saint Thomas Sunday John 20:19-31

Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you. And when He had so said, He shewed unto them His hands and His side. Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the Lord. Then said Jesus to them again, Peace be unto you: as My Father hath sent Me, even so send I you. And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and saith unto them, Receive ye the Holy Ghost: Whose soever sins ye remit, they are remitted unto them; and whose soever sins ye retain, they are retained. But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples

therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe. And after eight days again His disciples were within, and Thomas with them: then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace be unto you. Then saith He to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold My hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into My side: and be not faithless, but believing. And Thomas answered and said unto Him, My Lord and my God. Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen Me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed. And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book: But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name.(KJV)

The joy of Pascha continues. The disciples were blessed to see the Risen Christ. The Holy Apostle Thomas verified the presence of the Risen Christ. St. John's Gospel teaches about Christ's Resurrection.

St. John's Gospel said the miracles of Christ are recorded in order for believers to have life through Christ's name. Draw strength today and each day from the Gospel accounts of Christ's life.

Draw strength and nourishment from the Gospels and the Epistles of the New Testament throughout life. In the Epistle to the Hebrews we read: "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever." (Heb.13:8-KJV)

Pascha is a new beginning for believers. The Risen Christ is the enduring hope for all circumstances in life. Even death is powerless in the face of Christ. Christ convincingly rose from the dead.

Let us utilize this Paschal period which continues until the Feast of the Ascension as a period of new beginning in life. This is a time to embrace the life in Christ as never before embraced in life.

Now is the time to love Christ, be immersed in the Risen Christ and be grateful with joy to Christ. When Christ rose from the Tomb the darkness of Great and Holy Friday was replaced with unconquerable brightness.

Christ is the Light shining through the centuries. Christ is the Light guiding seekers to His Kingdom. Christ is the Light lifting individuals from the depths of depression and despair.

No illness is so great, no problem is too large as to be beyond Christ to make a decided difference. The Risen Christ turns suffering into joy. The Risen Christ turns depression and despair into hope.

To experience the power of Christ, believers' hearts, minds and souls need to rest in Christ. Believers need to love Christ first and foremost in life. Believers need to say with the Apostle Thomas: "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus Christ empowered His disciples with the ability to forgive sins. Today's Gospel documents this empowerment. Through the canonical laying on of hands of the apostles' successors, this empowerment continues to the present day.

Repentance throughout life enables believers to remain united with Christ. Repentance enables believers to have sins forgiven and to begin anew in Christ.

Christ welcomes repentant sinners with great joy. (Luke 15:7)

No need exists to feel distant from God. The Holy Apostle said: "He be not far from every one of us: For in him we live, and move, and have our being." (Acts 17:27-28.) God gives us life and enriches our lives.

We can never be sufficiently knowledgeable of God. We can never be sufficiently grateful to God. Our love will never equal the love God has for us and has given to us.

We can honor our responsibilities to God as Christians accepted at Holy Baptism. We can begin anew in this Paschal period to love and honor God more. We can seek to remain united with Christ to the fullest extent possible.

Each Divine Liturgy is an opportunity to unite with Christ. Each moment of every day is an opportunity to unite with God in prayer and to be thankful for blessings received.

We live in a country where we are free to worship. It is important that we protect and exercise that right. It is important that we make full use of that right.

To the extents we honor God, we improve not only ourselves but others.

To the extent we honor God in daily life, we treat others in our life as God would have them treated. The Risen Christ changed the world and improved the world.

Believers have the responsibility to follow Christ's example and teachings.

Believers have the responsibility to share the joy of the life in Christ. "Christ is Risen!" is the most powerful message of all centuries.

NEW YORK – The Holy Archdiocese of America cites the following announcement of the Ecumenical Patriarchate:

ECUMENICAL PATRIARCHATE

It is hereby announced that today Saturday, May 4, 2019, His All-Holiness the Ecumenical Patriarch received His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, Geron of America, who apprised Him on various affairs of his God-saved Eparchy.

Thereafter, His Eminence, the Archbishop submitted his written resignation from the throne of the Holy Archdiocese of America, which he shepherded with God-loving care for twenty years, and which the Patriarch will bring for consideration before the Holy and Sacred Synod in its upcoming meeting of next Thursday, May 9.

REMINDERS: <u>NO KNEELING</u> until the Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost Sunday. Instead of "Vechnaya Pam'yat" at the end of a Parastas or during a funeral service *until Ascension Thursday*, we sing "Christ is Risen!" Also, we do not say the prayer to the Holy Spirit "O Heavenly King" until Pentecost Sunday.
