Community—The essential element of Christianity is community Abbot Tryphon

Christianity is a communal faith, one that requires it's followers to be actively involved with others. The Church's worship is communal, and salvation itself is a corporate act, one that necessitates interaction with others. One is not "saved" in a vacuum, but as part of the corporal life of the Church. Your salvation must be as much a concern to me, as is my own salvation. My relationship with Christ is not about me, but about us. Our sins are not just against God, but against the Body of Christ, the Church. Our love of God can not be salvific if we do not love others, for just as the

Lord said, "If someone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? (1 John 4:20)".

Given the communal nature of the Church, it is particularly alarming to see increasing numbers of people isolating themselves from others. Many have turned to the Internet as the primary source of interaction with others, finding "friendships" with people who will never be met in person. Social interaction in the central square, as seen in traditional villages where the cafe life and church are the primary source of fraternal interaction, is the antidote to a future of increased estrangement from each other.

Isolated from others, the communal nature that is an important element in what it means to be human, is lost. It is thus imperative that we guard against the temptation of spending too much time in front of the computer, and too little time with others. The sight of young people sitting in coffee houses, together, yet apart, is troubling. Mobile phones, text messaging, iPods, communication through email, and countless hours on Facebook, leads to the furtherance of an isolation that is murdering the soul. As humans, we are meant to be together, for it is in our lives together that we grow in mind and spirit. It is in community that we learn to love God. For friendships to be limited to on-line chat rooms is a tragedy of major proportions, one that will ultimately be the ruin of society.

It amazes me how a humble thought instantly triggers the Grace of God.

Somehow a kitten came to me in the cell. The poor fellow, apparently, ate something wrong, poisoned himself, and now he asked for help, wriggling in pain, jumping like an octopus... It was a pity to look at him, but what would you do? Cross it once, another, no way! "Look at yourself," I said to myself then, "how long you have been a monk, and you can't even help an unhappy kitten!"

Only I blamed myself, the kitten, who was already at the last gasp, suddenly came to his senses. Ran up, began to rub on my legs and jump happily... That's the strength of humility! Therefore, it is said: "In our lowly state remember us Lord" (Psalm 135: 23.).

The Orthodox faith reared up such great Russian saints, as Venerable Sergius of Radonezh, Seraphim of Sarov laboring in the forests of Tambov, and the holy hierarchs Joasaph of Belgorod, and Tikhon of Voronezh. The names of these God-pleasers are dear not only for the Russian Orthodox

people, but are venerated with love far beyond the boundaries of our country. How rich is our fatherland in men of prayer, glorious saints who number more than four hundred. And how many ascetics are there, pleasing to God, whose names we do not know! And the number of saints increased especially in recent times, when for faith in Christ, for confessing the word of God, faithful sons of the Orthodox Church by their stability and courage defeated the devil and were blessed with heavenly crowns and eternal blessed life. *Archimandrite Kirill (Pavlov)*

When you go to confession, it is very important to simply say to God in your heart: "Lord, help me, tell me what to repent of, reveal the sin in me."
