I have been thinking lately on the passage in Matthew 25 where Jesus refers to the sheep and the goats and he says that passage that we hear every Meatfare Sunday where Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me."

We know the passage, we know its meaning. Something I have been thinking about this week is whether that meaning extends beyond just our human companions on this globe but also to the other creatures. If Adam, the first man, was called to be a steward of Creation, is it so far of a stretch to imagine that we may be held accountable for how we have treated the other animals and aspects of God's Creation?

This week, my wife how she was over at her parents' house and her mother picked up a bucket and a large spider was underneath it. My mother-in-law just stepped on the spider and my wife was upset because there was no reason to kill the spider outside. Yesterday, my wife was driving on an errand in our van and she noticed a garden spider had spun a web between the driver-side mirror and the frame of the car, dangling on a web that was breaking free. My wife returned home and with a stick, removed the spider and placed it in our garden.

Might seem rather silly, to pay so much attention to the plight of spiders, but I feel like our Orthodox view of the world should be to "do no harm" if possible, and while I would have no qualms about killing a thousand mosquitoes that wish to feed on me, I can appreciate a discomfort to squash animal life, even of such a comparatively low order as Araneae. It makes me wonder if we'll be held accountable for not only our actions but what we have done to this world itself at the last judgment.

The MERCY of God

"A priest is walking down a lonely road on a hot day when suddenly out of the bushes jumps a wild looking man with a gun.

The man says to the priest, "I have killed 99 men, and you will be the 100th."
