Glory be to Jesus Christ!

In Sunday's Sermon Series on the main Mysteries of the Church, the Mystery of Holy Unction was covered. The service is for healing and a part of our preparation for our salvation.

We can look at scripture for it's roots: "...let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven." (James 5:14-15)

The Unction Service is document as far back as the early 300's. When the opportunity presents itself, the service is done with 7 priests (and/or bishops). We have the service every year on Holy Wednesday prior to Pascha, but it can be done at any time of the year.

The truth is all the divine mysteries of the Church do only one thing! From Baptism, to Chrismation, to the Eucharist, to Confession, to Unction, to Marriage, to Ordination, and to all the other ways God communicates His grace to us; these divine mysteries accomplish one necessary task: They bring us into intimate communion with God Who IS our Healing, our Life, and our Salvation! The mysteries of the Church bring us closer to God and it is this closeness, this intimate connection with God that heals, and saves, and gives life to us as we participate in the life of the Church. We receive Him Who is our healing in the mystery of Holy Oil. This isn't some "magic" formula or rite performed by a tribal medicine man to make your headache go away. Receiving the Holy Anointing of Unction is nothing less than being brought closer to Christ [as we prepare for our salvation]. (Fr Barnabas Powell)

Repent

Matthew 3:1-2-In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea, And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

Heeding the words of St. John the Baptist has direct relevance for Christians today. Repentance is a constant necessity and expectation for Christians throughout life. Believers have their relationship set aright with the Lord by repenting of their sins. The merciful God looks at the hearts of individuals desiring to repent of sinfulness. God's love and mercy form the basis for hope when a person chooses to repent.

Matthew 3:8-Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance:

Repentance is reflected in the changes in the believer's heart, mind and actions. Vigilance arises within the believer to cease sinning and begin anew in Christ. Strength of mind is mustered with the help of God to repel inclinations to sin. Boldness becomes necessary to confront sinful ways and firmly repudiate them. Joy is an ultimate experience of repentance because of reunification with the Lord.

Matthew 3:11-I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance. but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire:

St. John the Baptist was aware of his place as a forerunner to the Lord Jesus Christ. St. John the Baptist and the Lord Jesus Christ spoke of the need for repentance. Repentance is necessary because believers stray into sinfulness all too frequently. Changes in the heart and mind occur when

the believer is seeking to repent of sin. Desire to be reunited with Christ and weariness of sinful ways foster repentance.

Matthew 4:17-From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

God's Holy Church teaches repentance and encourages repentance throughout life. The Divine services regularly educate believers about the very prevalence of sin. The Church commemorates the countless saints who repented from their sins. Vivid details are available about the lives of the saints changing dramatically. Verified lives of the saints offer proof and hope for sinners seeking to change.

Matthew 9:13-But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

Sinners find true hope in the welcoming and loving words of the Lord Jesus Christ. Christ's words are reassuring when sinners are seeking reunification with Christ. Knowing that Christ is willing to forgive and receive the sinner makes a difference. Fear needs to be overcome in taking the step to repent and return to Jesus Christ. Christ's love enables that fear to be overcome and for the repentance to take place.
