Fear God

Acts 10:2-A devout man, and one that feared God with all his house, which gave much alms to the people, and prayed to God alway. (KJV)

Keeping the Final Judgement by the Lord in mind keeps the focus on the Kingdom. Thoughts and actions are best weighed against the Lord God's commandments. Sincerely practicing love of God and love of neighbor are of primary importance. The forgiveness of others and seeking God's forgiveness are necessary every day. Each day is to be used well to prepare for Christ's return and Final Judgement. Having fear of God is fully compatible with loving the Lord God and neighbor.

Acts 10:22-And they said, Cornelius the centurion, a just man, and one that feareth God, and of good report among all the nation of the Jews, was warned from God by an holy angel to send for thee into his house, and to hear words of thee. (KJV)

Daily sins and less than pleasing behavior are known and visible to the Lord God. Words and actions of daily life form the believer's record for the Final Judgement. While time remains in life, repentance and beseeching God's mercy are essential. The immediate present is the time to restore the healthy relationship with God. The immediate present is the time to have healthy personal daily relationships. Fearing God and preparing well for the Final Judgement puts life into perspective.

Acts 13:16-Then Paul stood up, and beckoning with his hand said, Men of Israel, and ye that fear God, give audience. (KJV)

The time of Christ's glorious Second Coming and Final Judgement are not known. The remaining time of earthly life for each believer is known only to the Lord God. The time of life comes once and is to be used wisely according to God's way. Believers do well not to procrastinate in repenting and seeking God's mercy. God's Holy Church fosters and encourages repentance throughout earthy life. Being well-prepared for the Final Judgement is the expectation for every believer.

Acts 13:26-Men and brethren, children of the stock of Abraham, and whosoever among you feareth God, to you is the word of this salvation sent. (KJV)

The Lord's love and mercy restore wholeness to the sincerely repentant believer. God's forgiveness corresponds with the believer forgiving others in daily life. The joy of the Heavenly Kingdom and life eternal await believers fearing God. Nourishment exists within God's Holy Church to strengthen believers' efforts. The Lord God gives daily directions for the journey to the Heavenly Kingdom. Being prayerfully connected with the Lord keeps the believer ready for judgement.

Contrite

Psalm 33:19/34:18-The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit. (KJV)

The Lord is present to help those suffering from a broken heart and contrite spirit. Persons experiencing despair and great suffering have reason to hope in the Lord. Suffering and despair are overcome when turning to the Lord in faith and hope. There is always reason to hope in the Lord and never reason to yield to despair. The Lord Jesus Christ overcame the horrible crucifixion and rose from the dead. The darkness associated with Jesus' Crucifixion is replaced with Resurrection joy.

Psalm 50:19/51:17-The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise. (KJV)

The believer does well to search deep within the heart and root out any animosity. Resentment, despondency and judging others have no place in the believer's heart. Hope increases as the believer prostrates before the Lord in prayerful humility. The Lord God offers healing embrace to the believer willing to reject sinful ways. Repentance begins with acknowledging personal sin and taking full responsibility. Trusting the Lord facilitates the process of personal transformation in Jesus Christ.

Isaiah 57:15-For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

(KJV)

When experiencing a low point in earthly life turn full attention to the loving Lord. Devastating news or troubled relationships are best addressed with the Lord's help. The Lord God is very near to every believer reaching out in faith, hope and prayer. God is everywhere from the heights of the heavens and to far-reaches of the earth. God is always within reach even when the believer is at the lowest point in life. No problem or illness are too great to bring to the Lord for the needed perspective.

Isaiah 66:2-For all those things hath mine hand made, and all those things have been, saith the Lord: but to this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word.

(KJV)

Arrogance and pride are barriers to prayer and communication with the Lord God. Sincerity and humility facilitate entreaties when seeking the Lord God's mercies. Serious repentance will be reflected deeply in the believer's heart, mind and soul. Fear and trembling have a place in repentance when the believer seeks forgiveness. Sins have no proper place in the Christian life and deserve to be firmly repudiated. The Lord's love merits constant gratitude and the believer's lasting remembrance.

The Second Sunday of Great Lent Mark 2:1-12

And again he entered into Capernaum after some days; and it was noised that he was in the house. And straightway many were gathered together, insomuch that there was no room to receive them, no, not so much as about the door: and he preached the word unto them. And they come unto him, bringing one sick of the palsy, which was borne of four. And when they could not come nigh unto him for the press, they uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had broken it up, they let down the bed wherein the sick of the palsy lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee. But there was certain of the scribes sitting there, and reasoning in their hearts, Why doth this man thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only? And immediately when Jesus perceived in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, he said unto them, Why reason ye these things in your hearts? Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, Thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, Arise, and take up thy bed, and walk? But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy, I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy bed, and go thy way into thine house. And immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went forth before them all; insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion. (KJV)

St. Gregory Palamas John 10:9-16

I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and know my sheep, and am known of mine. As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep. And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd. (KJV)

Believers in the Holy Orthodox Church are called to actively participate in the journey to Pascha. The Church provides Great Lent to facilitate the full life in the Lord Jesus Christ.

St. John's Gospel for today describes the Lord Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd. The Shepherd knows His sheep and is known to them. The Good Shepherd protects His sheep and is willing to lay down His life for them.

Serious believers value Jesus Christ as the Good Shepherd. Serious believers rejoice and are strengthened by Christ. Jesus Christ brings life more abundantly. Believers adhere to Christ's teachings to experience life more abundantly.

During Great Lent, the Church encourages believers to repent of their sins. St. Mark's Gospel for today describes Jesus' forgiving the sins and healing the man with palsy. Each person has the opportunity to seek forgiveness and healing.

Sin is to be firmly rejected and abhorred by Christians. Welcoming and harboring sinful thoughts and performing sinful actions prevent the abundant life in Christ.

Jesus describes Himself as the Door through which entry can be made for the person to be saved. God's Holy Church is the opening to the Door for the believer. Christ the Door is always open for the believer seeking salvation.

Many doors exist in the world to paths to destruction. Some doors open to destinations far from the Heavenly Kingdom. There are doors which open to experiences of misery.

God's Holy Church provides the Gospel and nourishing teachings to keep the believer on the path to the Heavenly Kingdom. The Church offers life more abundantly in the Divine services.

The Precious Body and Blood of Jesus Christ enable believers to be firmly and fully united with Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ enters and radiates within the communing believer.

The journey to Pascha is underway in the Church. Great Lent is to be taken seriously as salvation of the soul is of utmost seriousness. The soul is not to be jeopardized or to be cast into sin.

Believers are encouraged to restore purity to life. Becoming more unified with and like Christ is the intended goal of Great Lent. The joy of Christ's Resurrections beckons believers to be serious each day of Great Lent.

The time of each day is a gift from God to be treasured and used for God's glory. Believers learn in and from the Church ways to live pleasing to the Lord.

Beginning anew in Christ is possible while consciousness remains in the body.





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


A few quick comments on lighting candles: In Holy Orthodoxy it has been a tradition for centuries to light candles in the church.

The easiest way to remember where to light them:

Left-LIVING
