The Third Sunday of Great Lent Veneration of the Holy Cross Mark 8:34-38, 9:1

And when he had called the people unto him with his disciples also, he said unto them, Whosoever will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; but whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it. For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul? Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels. And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, That there be some of them

that stand here, which shall not taste of death, till they have seen the kingdom of God come with power. (KJV)

The third Sunday of Great Lent has arrived. The intensity of the journey to Pascha is increasing. The focus this week is on the Cross of Christ. Serious believers draw strength and purpose from Jesus Christ's Cross.

Passions, temptations, and personal sinfulness are crushed with the Lord's help. Serious believers confront personal sinfulness with honesty, repent, confess and begin anew in Jesus Christ.

The journey to Pascha intends the salvation of the soul. The soul is most valuable. Believers are to protect, honor and nourish the soul at all costs. The Church provides Great Lent for believers to clearly address care of the soul.

The Lord Jesus Christ's sacrifice on the Cross embodies His love for each person. Renewal in Jesus Christ comes through repentance, confession and restored unity with Christ.

Daily honoring Great Lent as intended by the Church enables believers to address the hunger of the soul for peace with Christ. Increased prayer, fasting and almsgiving facilitate repentance and renewal.

Lenten services in the church offer instruction and nourishment beneficial to the soul. Serious believers benefit from Lenten services and are transformed by their personal participation.

Attendant joy characterizes the journey to Pascha for the active believer. Believers adhering to the Church's teachings firmly reject sinful ways and embrace the life in Christ.

The Lord Jesus Christ grows in the believer and the believer grows in Christ to the degree the believer honors Great Lent and the journey to Pascha. Believers giving themselves completely to Christ benefit beyond measure.

St. Mark's Gospel speaks of the Kingdom of God coming with power. The Gospel reading for today states those losing their lives for Christ and the Gospel save their lives.

Refraining from the sinful ways offered by worldly temptations is essential in the Lenten journey. Evil thrives in the world and at times can deceptively appear to be appealing. Unity with the Lord involves following the narrow path.

St Matthew's Gospel states: "...wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because strait is the gate, and **narrow** is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it." (Mt. 7:13-14)

The Christian life requires personal discipline. Believers desiring peace and eternal life say "no" to temptations that put the soul in peril. Loving

Christ involves taking up personal crosses in daily life as Christ took up His Cross.

Active and attentive prayer keeps the mind centered in Christ. The images a person lets into the home, the mind, the heart, and the soul affect personal disposition and actions.

The home, heart, mind, and soul are to be vigilantly guarded to ensure Christ is ever-present and welcome. Evil has very cunning ways of getting into the home, the mind, heart, and soul.

Images on the television, phones and computers can assault the mind, heart and soul. Families can unwittingly allow images into their homes which threaten peace and harmony of the mind, heart, and soul.

Believers need to be alert as to what enters the mind, the heart, and the soul.

Bodily senses and energy are intended for blessed purposes. Use of speech and hearing have no place in the judgment of others.

Love, peace, and joy are epitomized in the Crucified and Risen Christ. Serious believers seeking to grow in Christ use Great Lent and the journey to Pascha to learn more about the Crucified and Resurrected Christ.

When Holy Week arrives and Pascha is eventually celebrated, the believers actively honoring Great Lent and the journey to Pascha will realize personal changes in their selves.

Jesus Christ grows in the person to the degree the person loves Christ and is united with Christ. Constant repentance and communion make the full life in Christ possible.

God's Holy Church provides Great Lent and the journey to Pascha for the benefit of all. Wise individuals seeking complete unity with Jesus Christ take up their crosses and follow Christ.

The Fourth Sunday of Great Lent Mark 9:17-31

And one of the multitude answered and said, Master, I have brought unto thee my son, which hath a dumb spirit; And wheresoever he taketh him, he teareth him: and he foameth, and gnasheth with his teeth, and pineth away: and I spake to thy disciples that they should cast him out; and they could not. He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him unto me. And they brought him unto him: and when he saw him, straightway the spirit tare him; and he fell on the ground, and wallowed foaming. And he asked his father, How long is it ago since this came unto him? And he said, Of a child. And ofttimes it hath cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him: but if thou canst do any thing, have compassion on us, and help us. Jesus said unto him, If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief. When Jesus saw that the people came running together, he rebuked the foul spirit, saying unto him, Thou dumb and deaf spirit, I charge thee, come out of him, and enter no more into him. And the spirit cried, and rent him sore, and came out of him: and he was as one dead; insomuch that many said, He is dead. But Jesus took him by the hand, and lifted him up; and he arose. And when he was come into the house, his disciples asked him privately, Why could not we cast him out? And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. And they departed thence, and passed through Galilee; and he would not that any man should know it. For he taught his disciples, and said unto them, The Son of man is delivered into the hands of men, and they shall kill him; and after that he is killed, he shall rise the third day. (KJV)

St. John Climacus Matthew 4:25-5:12

And there followed Him great multitudes of people from Galilee, and from Decapolis, and from Jerusalem, and from Judaea, and from beyond Jordan. And seeing the multitudes, He went up into a mountain: and when He was set, his disciples came unto Him: And He opened His mouth, and taught them, saying, Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted. Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth. Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled. Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God. Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you. (KJV)

Today the Holy Orthodox Church arrives at the Fourth Sunday of Great Lent. The journey to Pascha is well underway. The events of Great and Holy Week and Pascha are beginning to appear on the horizon.

St. Mark's Gospel for today speaks of Jesus' arrest, death, and resurrection. Believers actively participating in the journey to Pascha cherish the Gospel readings.

Jesus' power to heal the afflicted son is clearly described in St. Mark's Gospel. The value of strong belief, prayer and fasting are credited as necessary for healing to occur.

Active participants in the journey to Pascha experience the healing power of the Lord Jesus Christ. Participating in Great Lent by increased prayer and fasting with firm belief results in changes to the believer.

Christ increases in lives of believers participating in the Divine services of Great Lent. Strong faith, prayer and fasting facilitate the transformation in Christ. Partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ makes a difference in the believer.

The journey to Pascha is a journey of joy. The pain of the Cross and the suffering of Christ are always in the serious believer's mind. Christ's voluntary suffering and death made possible the unforgettable Resurrection joy.

Grateful believers regularly express gratitude to the Crucified and Risen Lord. Gratitude takes many different forms. Demonstrating love, forgiveness and compassion in daily relationships are the best forms of gratitude toward God.

Being humble and gracious in personal relationships and caring for the soul are ways to show appreciation to the Lord. Ardently following the Lord's commandments reflect deep love for the Lord.

Daily life entails a constant internal battle with evil arising in the heart, mind, and soul. This Fourth Sunday of Great Lent is dedicated to St. John

Climacus. St. John Climacus is known for defining steps for growth in Jesus Christ.

The journey to Pascha intends growth in Jesus Christ for each participant. All believers in the Church are called to participate in the journey unified in faith and love for the Lord.

Believers around the world and through the centuries unite in the journey to Pascha. Christ's betrayal, arrest, trial, crucifixion, burial, and resurrection are in believers' hearts, minds, and souls of every century.

This Fourth Sunday of Great Lent challenges believers to push forward in the journey to Pascha. The Lord provides daily strength for the journey. Jesus Christ did not shy away from the tragedy of His Death.

Jesus Christ did not withdraw from being arrested and tortured. Christ faced His accusers. Christ defeated death and resurrected. The journey to Pascha is a timeless lesson for believers bringing newness to life each year.

God's Holy Church in wisdom provides Great Lent, Holy Week and Pascha.

Refuge

Psalm 45/46:1-God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. (KJV)

The Lord God is ever ready to receive persons turning to Him in faith and hope. Sincere believers are never disappointed when seeking refuge in the Lord God. The Lord is the definitive Source of protection and strength for seekers of refuge. The Lord God offers refuge for persons experiencing serious personal problems. The soul finds peace, purpose, and clarity when refuge is taken in the Lord God.

Psalm 45/46:7-The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Selah. (KJV)

God is ever-present and within reach during the believer's earthly existence. God is always within reach to believers reaching out in prayer and firm faith. Seeking refuge in the Lord is a beneficial life-changing and life-renewing action. Hunger in the soul is addressed when believers turn to the Lord seeking refuge. When refuge is taken in the Lord, the world's problems no longer seem as great.

Psalm 56/57:1-Be merciful unto me, O God, be merciful unto me: for my soul trusteth in thee: yea, in the shadow of thy wings will I make my refuge, until these calamities be overpast. (KJV)

Taking refuge in the Lord enables believers to face the difficult storms of life. Serious believers place full confidence in the value of taking refuge in the Lord. The world's problems look differently when the believer takes refuge in the Lord. When the believer takes refuge in the Lord, the heart experiences needed peace. The Lord provides a protective shield around believers seeking personal refuge.

Psalm 61:8/62:7-In God is my salvation and my glory: the rock of my strength, and my refuge, is in God. (KJV)

Believers experience salvation when turning to the Lord completely for refuge. God's values become the believer's values when refuge is taken in the Lord. Eternal life becomes the new reality of refuge seekers in the Lord's midst. Old ways and old habits are cast behind as life begins anew in the Lord God. The Lord God strengthens believers turning to Him for refuge and salvation.

Psalm 61:9/62:8-Trust in him at all times; ye people, pour out your heart before him: God is a refuge for us. Selah. (KJV)

Honesty with the self and the Lord are expected when the believer takes refuge. The Lord God is attentive to believers pouring out their hearts when in refuge. Comforting love, mercy and compassion characterize taking refuge in the Lord. Life is renewed for believers taking refuge in the Lord and seeking salvation. Taking refuge in the Lord results in gratitude and joy arising in the believer's heart.
