The Second Sunday after Pentecost Matthew 4:18-23

And Jesus, walking by the sea of Galilee, saw two brethren, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. And they straightway left their nets, and followed him. And going on from thence, he saw other two brethren, James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, in a ship with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and he called them. And they immediately left the ship and their father, and followed him. And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner

of sickness and all manner of disease among the people. (KJV) The Lord Jesus Christ offers healing and the Kingdom of God for those choosing to follow Him. Believers are to leave behind all that inhibits the full love of God when choosing to follow Christ.

The Church nourishes and guides the believer from Baptism to eternal life and God's Kingdom. God's saints open the paths to follow and shine the light of Christ through their lives. The saints show that following Christ is very possible.

When doubts occur in the mind, Jesus Christ is ever-present to reassure the believer and renew the call to follow Him. Peter, Andrew, James, and John in the present Gospel follow Jesus Christ without hesitation.

We know from the Church's history that Peter, Andrew, James, and John lived in Christ in ways that are of lasting value. The Holy Apostles Peter, Andrew, James, and John are of immeasurable benefit to every generation.

The hunger in the soul is addressed and filled when the believer says 'Yes' to the call of Christ throughout all of life. Evil is to be firmly rejected and the life in Jesus Christ is to be fully embraced.

Repentance is Always Timely

Matthew 4:17- From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. (KJV)

Sincere repentance is always timely and beneficial for believers during earthly life. Repentance is necessary to cleanse the self of sins and to begin anew in Christ. Believers think and act in ways offensive to the Lord God necessitating repentance. God's reassuring love provides the hope and motivation for believers to repent. Desire for firm unity with the Lord Jesus Christ facilitates repentance in believers.

Luke 13:5- I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish. (KJV)

Failure to repent carries with it the threat and peril of serious danger to the soul. Constant care of the believer's soul is necessary and requires great vigilance. The soul and the relationship with Jesus Christ are of primary importance in life. Sins put the believer in an undesirable position for the great and final judgment. The Lord knows each believer's thoughts and actions and will judge accordingly.

Acts 3:19- Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord. (KJV)

Believers have the opportunity to repent while the mind is wellfunctioning. Opportunities to repent are not to be wasted as life may end unexpectedly. Repentance affords the opportunity to seek eternal life and to avoid damnation. Receiving forgiveness of sins is possible until the very last moment of life. Repentance restores joy to life and increases love and appreciation for God.

2 Corinthians 7:10- For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death. (KJV)

The life in Christ involves taking responsibility for sin and embracing repentance. Repentance includes the combined action of the believer's heart, mind, and soul. The primary way believers can reconcile with God is through sincere repentance. The life in Christ improves when the believer repents and seeks to begin anew. Unless We Become as Little Children

Matthew 18:3- And said, Verily I say unto you, Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. (KJV)

A number of years ago when my twin grandsons were very young, they went to the parish cemetery adjacent to the church parking lot. While playing in the cemetery, they began to reverently kiss the crosses located there.

As the two boys exited the cemetery, they passed by my car, a Chevrolet. They stopped at the front of the car and kissed the emblem on the front. My grandsons viewed the emblem as a cross to be kissed.

I had owned many Chevrolets before this particular day. During decades of driving, I never viewed the standard emblem on a Chevrolet as

a cross. Ever since the day my grandsons kissed the emblem, I have viewed the emblem as a cross.

If my memory is correct, somewhere in my reading of the writings of St. Nicholai Velimirovic, I learned about viewing objects in daily life that are shaped as a cross. Strength and inspiration can be drawn from these images.

As we grow into adulthood, we often lose the simplicity of viewing events and occurrences in daily life. Our views of daily life, objects, and happenings are shaped and influenced by experiences with the passing of time.

Simple clarity may get lost in the process of human life experience. These young boys saw a cross before them and they approached it reverently. Their lives, vision, and understanding had not been distorted with experiences of many years.

In previous years of giving sermons, I very rarely mentioned personal experiences. Shortly after the boys kissed the emblem on my car, I included a description of their actions in a Sunday sermon.

The boys' kissing the cross in their heartfelt simplicity resulted in the most memorable of comments. The comments received were totally unexpected.

Describing the boys' actions made an impact.

Preaching the Gospel and attempting to live by the Gospel is the greatest of blessings and honors. Sermon preparation is a learning and sharing experience.

The heart, mind, and soul are nourished in the process.

Drawing strength and direction from God are essential in sermon preparation. Consistent use of the Holy Scriptures strengthens, and gives root and anchor to sermons.

Sermons need to be easily understood and touch the heart, mind, and soul. My grandsons in their simple actions taught me a lesson that continues to be of value.

<u>Prisoners</u>

Psalm 69:33-For the Lord heareth the poor, and despiseth not his prisoners. (KJV)

The Lord God is attentive to the hearts, minds and souls of the imprisoned. God responds to repentant hearts, minds and souls of those seeking forgiveness. The imprisoned have the opportunity through repentance to seek God's Kingdom. Prison chains, walls, and bars do not prevent a person from seeking repentance. God's love is able to bring forgiveness and healing to the most notorious sinner.

Psalm 102-20-To hear the groaning of the prisoner; to loose those that are appointed to death; (KJV)

Each person is an individual before God whether in the community or imprisoned. Individuals are created in God's image and likeness and experience God's love. Attentive individuals recognize God's love and embrace God's forgiveness. Accepting God's forgiveness of personal sin facilitates learning to love God. God's love heals, makes well and whole the repentant sinner's broken heart.

Psalm 146:7-Which executeth judgment for the oppressed: which giveth food to the hungry. The Lord looseth the prisoners: (KJV)

Narrow thinkers will bring to mind those locked up in jail and prison cells. Individuals in the community commit crimes of the heart, mind, and soul. Repentance is required of all sins by the believers seeking renewal in Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ is the only way to health, wellness, and wholeness. Embracing Christ makes overcoming the chains of sin possible and desirable.
