St. Mary of Egypt Luke 7:36-50

And one of the Pharisees desired him that he would eat with him. And he went into the Pharisee's house, and sat down to meat. And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment, And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment. Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner. The Fifth Sunday of Great Lent-St. Mary of Egypt

The Church is rapidly approaching the end of Great Lent. Each day offers believers opportunities to greatly benefit the soul. St. Mary of Egypt stands before believers in the Church as a primary example of repentance.

Daily believers are encouraged to fall down before the Lord God and seek forgiveness. The suffering of Jesus Christ on the Cross serves as the supreme reminder of Christ's love for every person.

St. Luke's Gospel for today describes Jesus' willingness to forgive sinners. Jesus' love and mercy for sinners is evident in the Gospel. St. Luke's Gospel shines the ray of hope for every sinner.

Jesus describes His forthcoming arrest, death, and resurrection in St. Mark's Gospel. The journey to Pascha is guided by the foreknowledge of Jesus Christ's arrest, suffering, death, and resurrection.

Believers find definition, meaning, and hope for their lives in the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ creates the pathways for life eternal. Jesus' defeat of death assures believers of the possibility of the general resurrection.

The day of Jesus' return to judge the living and the dead remains unknown. Each Great Lent serves as precious time for wise believers to prepare for the Great and Final Judgment.

St. Many of Egypt made full benefit of the opportunity to repent. St. Mary progressed from being a flagrant sinner to becoming a saint. She is an inspiring model of repentance for all in the Church.

Every person regardless of the degree of personal sin can find hope in the life of St. Mary of Egypt. Repentance is possible for believers with the mind and willingness to repent.

The Lenten journey is an immeasurable blessing for believers. The Lenten journey provides for renewal and growth in the Lord Jesus Christ. New life in Christ is great joy.

Holy Baptism is the beginning experience with Jesus Christ. Repentance keeps the believer on the narrow path to God's Kingdom. Repentance keeps the possibility of eternal life alive.

At home, the family gathered to begin the holy meal.


But shortly thereafter I wondered if it was all real.
