

Mim Bizic offers:

In honor of Nikola Tesla's 158th Birthday, and my own Licani (Lika) roots, I'd also like to share some information on the famous inventor whose name grows more popular every day.

No one researched Nikola Tesla more (that I know) than the late Dan Mrkich. Luckily, the American SRBOBRAN of the Serb National Federation featured Dan's work in installments. Here is the one on Tesla's Mother, Georgina-Djuka Tesla 1822-1892.

Dan wrote: "The man who invented the 20th Century 'is by birth, heritage and his human consciousness, is a Serb.'" His father, Milutin, was an excellent Serbian Orthodox priest, learned and devout. Milutin was born in 1819 in the village of Raduc, Lika, to his father Nikola, who was an officer in the Krajina border guards, and his mother Ana nee Kalinic was also a daughter of an army officer. Milutin was consecrated a priest in 1846.

Djuka Tesla, Nikola Tesla's mother, was an extraordinarily gifted woman. She was the daughter of Nikola Mandic (1800-1863), a Serbian Orthodox priest in Gracac. She was also the granddaughter of another Serbian priest, Toma Buidsavljevic (1777-1840). She married Milutin in 1847 and they had 5 children: Dane (1848-1863); Milak (later married name Glumicic); Angelina (married name Trbojevic), Marija (married named Kosanovich); and Nikola (1856-1943). The first three were born in Senj and the youngest in Smiljan.

Nikola Tesla's original Baptism certificate can be seen in the Nikola Tesla Museum in Belgrade. His certificate states that he was born on June 28 (July 10 with the new calendar!) June 28-Vidovdan! The parents were listed as Milutin and Georgina, home address is Smiljan, house number 227.

Nikola was christened the very next day by the Serbian Orthodox priest from nearby Gospic, Fr. Toma Oklobdzija, and his godfather KUM was Jovan Drenovac, a Captain in the Krajina army, also of Gospic.

All together in the Mandic-Tesla families in a span of less than 200 years, there were 36 Serbian Orthodox priests, serving in the parishes of Lika. By WWII, there were six priests in Lika. One died of old age, five were killed by Croat fascists, and "one of them," write Dan Mrkich, "died under tortures fit only to describe as courtroom evidence.

Milutin Tesla died in 1863 in Gospic. Djuka continued to live in the town, supported by her brother Archimandrite Nikola, and later by son Nikola who went to America in 1884. Djuka died April 15, 1892, on Easter.

Tesla raised individual tombstones of white marble and of the same height and likeness to both his parents. Almost destroyed and badly desecrated in WWII and then again in this last 1990's war in Yugoslavia, trying to erase all traces of the Serbs from the Krajina area, these have since been restored by the Croatian government noting the desirability of tourism to see Tesla's birthplace.

Tesla loved his mother, "an inventor of the first order," a true artist and visionary—the "white dove" of his later years—and credited her with whatever inventiveness and destiny in life he possessed. "Djuka Tesla," Dan Mrkich writes, "is one of the remarkable women in the history of the Serbian people. The world, especially the Serbs, owe her a debt of gratitude.

At various times in Tesla's life he would declare, "My religion is the religion of my father," and "by nationality, I am a Serb, of course."

When he was already in his 80's he gladly accepted to be the godfather of the new St. Sava Serbian Orthodox Church in Gary, Indiana, which was consecrated on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 24, 1938. The American SRBOBRAN carried articles about Tesla and the new church in its issues of Nov. 15, 22, and 28, 1938.

Although in dire financial straights by then, recovering from injuries received when struck by a taxi cab in New York, Tesla donated \$500 to the new church—a considerable amount of money in those days.

Dan Mrkich was the Secretary of the Canada Tesla Memorial Society, and the author of "Od Like do Nijagare" (From Lika to Niagara).

At the time of this writing (American SRBOBRAN, March 28, 2001), Dan Mrkich asked, "Why is the birthplace of one of the most important inventors of the electric age being neglected, his museum vandalized and his heritage ignored?"

Nikola Tesla wrote in 1924: "The mother's loss grips one's head more powerfully than any other sad experience in life."
