

The Fifth Sunday after Pentecost Matthew 8:28-9:1

And when he was come to the other side into the country of the Gergesenes, there met him two possessed with devils, coming out of the tombs, exceeding fierce, so that no man might pass by that way. And, behold, they cried out, saying, What have we to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God? art thou come hither to torment us before the time? And there was a good way off from them an herd of many swine feeding. So the devils besought him, saying, If thou cast us out, suffer us to go away into the herd of swine. And he said unto them, Go. And when they were come out, they went into the herd of swine: and, behold, the whole herd of swine ran violently down a steep place into the sea, and perished in the waters. And they that kept them fled, and went their ways into the city, and told everything, and what was befallen to the possessed of the devils. And, behold, the whole city came out to meet Jesus: and when they saw him, they besought him that he would depart out of their coasts. And he entered into a ship, and passed over, and came into his own city. (KJV)

The Holy Gospel is read at each Divine Liturgy for the benefit and nourishment of each person present. Attentive listeners take the Gospel to heart and incorporate the contents in daily life.

The present Gospel verifies the Lord Jesus Christ's power over devils. Individuals will encounter attacks from devils during their earthly lives. Jesus Christ fortifies believers with the present Gospel to confront attacks by the devil.

Keeping Jesus Christ firmly in the heart, mind, and soul keeps the believer strong. Jesus Christ gives believers life. He gives life abundantly. (Jn.10:10) Individuals do not have to suffer when faced with devils.

Devils can take different forms. Devils may attack in creating fears that inhibit the believer from certain undertakings. In the present Gospel the devils blocked the passage way prohibiting travel.

With God everything is possible. (Mt. 19:26) Overcoming of fear is possible with God. God made water come out of rock. (Num. 20:11) Jesus restored life to the dead son of the widow of Nain. (Lk.7:11-15) Jesus restored life to Lazarus four days dead. (Jn.11:44)

Jesus rose from the dead after being crucified and buried.(Mk. 16:6) Devils are powerless when faced with Jesus Christ. The present Gospel provides firm hope for attentive believers.

Thoughts inspired by the devil may arise in a person's mind. Turning to Jesus Christ in firm belief is the way to expel such thoughts. The Jesus Prayer, "Lord Jesus Christ Son of God have mercy on me a sinner" will defeat the devil.

The Gospel nourishes and strengthens the heart, mind, and soul. From the time of Baptism until departure from this life, believers will confront devils. When armed and protected with Jesus Christ, the believer is protected.

Holy Apostle Paul in the Epistle to the Ephesians said: "Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil." (Eph. 6:11)

Jesus Christ opens the path from the Baptism font to the Kingdom of Heaven and eternal life. Jesus Christ is the way, the truth, and life. (Jn,14:6) Believers are to travel the narrow path opened and defined by Christ. (Mt. 7:14)

Devils blocking the passage way is made clear in the present Gospel. Individuals may find themselves feeling blocked in their daily lives. They may feel devils prohibiting them from moving forward in their lives.

Yielding and surrendering to the devils arising in life is self-defeating. Jesus Christ is ever-present for believers to live in the fullness of life. Through prayer and fasting, believers can turn to Christ to open the path to the Kingdom. (Mk. 9:29)

In addition to the Gospel, believers have their lives enriched with the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus Christ at the Divine Liturgy. Partaking of Holy Communion unites and empowers the believer with Christ.

The Divine Liturgy is an essential part of the path for believers traveling from the Baptismal font to the Heavenly Kingdom. The Divine Liturgy is a foretaste of the Kingdom. Believers experience Jesus Christ directly in the Divine Liturgy.

Much darkness exists in the present world. Devils contribute to and are part of that darkness. Jesus Christ brings light to darkness. Jesus Christ removes the darkness in life.


The Divine Liturgy shines forth the Light of Christ. Believers travel freely on the path to the Kingdom when participating in the Divine Liturgy. Believers firmly journey with Jesus Christ when fully participating in the Divine Liturgy.

Jesus Christ is more than sufficient to eradicate the devils appearing in life. Jesus Christ brings peace and joy to life's journey. Jesus provides hope and replaces frustration when blockages by devils arise.

Jesus Christ is due constant gratitude. Attentively participating in the Divine Liturgy is the way to express gratitude and grow in Christ. Growth in Christ is always possible while the mind functions and the believer is willing.

Believers seeking to grow in life will turn to Christ to overcome any devils that appear. Increased attendance at the Divine Liturgy keeps the path to the Kingdom open and facilitates growth in Christ.





The Orthodox Baptism of a Civil War Veteran

Last week, **we published the story of William Hoskins**, an 89-year-old veteran of the American Civil War who traveled from Los Angeles to San Francisco in December 1900 to be baptized into the Orthodox faith by St Sebastian Dabovich. Shortly after this, Fr Kirill Sokolov, dean of Holy Trinity Cathedral (OCA) in San Francisco, sent me the baptismal record for Hoskins, recorded by St Sebastian in the cathedral's metrical book and preserved to this day.

Fr Kirill had Robert A. Parent translate these pages. Here's the entry for Hoskins:

John-American citizen retired pensioned soldier William A. Hoskin converted to Orthodoxy from the Baptists (who baptized with only one immersion) and named John through Baptism of the Holy Orthodox Church. John is 89 and resides at the Soldiers Home, California.—Hieromonk Sebastian

This page concludes with a summary of all the baptisms (including infants) done at the cathedral in 1900:

In the course of all the year 1900 there were born 18 males and 11 females. In addition there were 5 conversions to Orthodoxy (one male and 4 females) and one conversion from the Baptist sect. The entries were recorded timely and accurately with one exception: the number of male births was actually 17 since a seventeen-year-old male was included in conversions.

I am grateful to Fr Kirill and Mr Parent for finding and translating this record!

Arianism: The Father created the Son of God: "There was a time when the Son did not exist". Therefore, Jesus was not God, only a "substance" similar to the Father; a demi-god or super angel, but not perfect mediator.

Pnematomachi: Claimed the Holy Spirit is a creature, not God; Apollinarism: The Eternal Logos replaced the soul. Therefore, Christ had a divine mind but no rational soul (intellect).

Nestorianism: Jesus was two separate persons, human & divine working together. Mary was mother only of the human person: Mother of the Christ.

Monophysitism: An over-reaction against Nestorianism's doctrine that Christ was only human. It asserted Jesus's humanity was not assumed by divinity but absorbed, like sugar in water. Therefore, Jesus has one nature: divine.

Various Errors (Nestorianism): Tried to argue again that Jesus' humanity was a distinct personal subject.

Monothelitism: Asserted Jesus had only a single operation: a divine will, but not a human will.

Iconoclasm: The Byzantine emperor forbid veneration of holy icons possibly influenced by Muslim antipathy to images. Iconoclasts destroyed images of Christ and the saints claiming they were idolatrous.



Nicaea I (325 A.D.): Produced the Creed confessing the Son, Image & Word of the Father, is eternally-begotten, not made, consubstantial (the same divine essence) with the Father; Christ is true God from true God, only Mediator [Hb. 1:3; Ti. 2:13].




Constantinople I (381 A.D.): The Holy Spirit is the "Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father". The Spirit is equally adored with the Father & Son; The Lord Jesus is fully man (human intellect) capable of growing in human knowledge [Lk. 2:52].





Chalcedon (451 A.D.): The Son of God assumed a sinless human nature without altering it (fully man), nor did his humanity compromise His divinity (fully God). Therefore, Christ has two distinct, complete natures united inseparably but not confused in his divine personhood [Co. 2:9].

Constantinople II (553 A.D.): Reaffirmed that Jesus is one divine personal subject (hypostasis) who did not cease being God as a man.





Nicaea II (787 A.D.): Adoration is reserved to God alone (whose essence is transcendent), but since the Son was the visible, finite "icon of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation" [Co. 1:15], He and his Body (saints) can be depicted in images which are honored (not adored) to transfer respect over to the person(s) they represent. Thus icons testify Christ had a true Body capable of being seen [1 Jn. 1:1], and his visible ministry continues through the Church [Co. 1:18; 1 Co. 4:1].

Let us not blackmail God with our prayers. Let us not ask God to free us from something, illness, etc., or to solve our problems, but let us ask Him for strength and support to endure them. - Saint Porphyrios of Kavsokalyvia
